According to the researchers from University of British Columbia (UBC), Harvard Medical School and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK), they have found out early genetic origins of breast cancer-like mutations appearing in the cells of healthy women. Furthermore, genetic alterations were only detected in the luminal cells that line the lobules and ducts where milk flows through the breast. In addition, the majority of mutated cells contained only one or two copy number alterations, and it's known that it takes multiple mutations to form a cancer.
