<u>OFF BLOCK STICKERS:</u> Any students who would like an off block sticker please come to the office during your off block with your student ID card and student schedule.


STUDENT PARKING PASS: If you will be parking in the lower parking lot please come to the office at lunch to pick up a Parking Registration form.

2019 PSAT TEST: WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16 – If you're thinking of college in the U.S. you will need either a SAT or ACT score for admission consideration. PMSS offers the Practice SAT to Port Moody students, an inexpensive way to prepare for the SAT. Registration fee is \$30, payable by cash or by cheque made out to Port Moody Secondary School. Test will start at 3:10 pm and takes approximately 3.5 hours. Registration begins *September 24*; bring your \$30 fee to Mr. Gibney in the Counselling Centre to register for the PSAT. 35 seats are available, first come, first registered – registration with full fee payment closes **FRIDAY,** *OCTOBER 11*.
