#### APPLICATION DEADLINES LOOMING FOR LARGER UNIVERSITIES

While the majority of BC universities and colleges have flexible admission processes to first year university in most programs, the three largest BC public universities along with one specialty institution have very early 2020 deadlines that students cannot miss if they want to be considered. Here are these deadline dates to apply for 1st year admission in September 2020:

**UBC**: Application deadline for all programs is **January 15th, 2020 SFU**: Application deadline for all programs is **January 31, 2020** 

**UVIC**: Application deadline-all programs [except Nursing] is **February 28, 2020 Emily Carr University**: Admission deadline is **January 15** to all programs.

### **NURSING PROGRAMS - APPLICATION DEADLINES 2020**

Perhaps the most competitive program admissions in BC are for Nursing [Bachelor of Science in Nursing - BSN] degree programs right across the province. Here are some upcoming deadlines:

UVIC/CAMOSUN: Students applying to UVIC Nursing must apply through one of our partner colleges. The deadline for students applying to the Camosun College/UVic BSN program for September 2020 is **December 15, 2019** at noon.

OKANAGAN COLLEGE: BSN (Years 1 and 2) - January 15, 2020

THOMPSON RIVERS UNIVERSITY: BSN – January 31, 2020

UNIVERSITY OF THE FRASER VALLEY: BSN – January 31, 2020

DOUGLAS COLLEGE: Applications **open** for *Academic Foundation for Potential Nursing Applicants* – the first year for our Nursing program – on **February 1st for the Winter 2021** intake for students that missed Fall 2020 deadline. *This will only be open for 3 days.* 

COLLEGE OF THE ROCKIES: Deadline to apply to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program is **February 15th** and all the academic requirements, including a CASPer Assessment, must be submitted by **February 28th**.

COAST MOUNTAIN COLLEGE: Applications must be received by March 31 and all supporting documents by April 15.
