**STUDENT MYED LOG INS:** On **Tuesday, May 11<sup>th</sup>** Student MyEd log ins will be changing. This change is happening at all schools in SD43, although the day of the change may be different for different schools. Please note that this does not impact parent accounts. On May 11<sup>th</sup>, students will receive an auto-generated email with their new MyEd login id (pupil #) and generated password. When students receive this email they will need to follow the instructions to log in. This may require students to create a new security question and answer. Once they do this, students are encouraged to keep their new password somewhere safe for future log ins. The major benefit of this change will be that students will be able to keep their same account if they move between schools. This would include moves from middle to secondary.

## Emergency Procedure Information for Parents

During an emergency five key responses can be implemented based on situation and context. Regular school safety drills are conducted throughout the year.

### **DROP, COVER & HOLD ON**

Used in the event of an earthquake or explosion.

#### Procedures:

- DROP to the ground.
- Take COVER under a sturdy desk or table, and
- HOLD ON until the shaking stops.
- Wait 60 seconds and then EVACUATE (see Evacuation Procedures).

### **EVACUATE**

Used when a building or area becomes unsafe due to: fire, flood, chemical accident or following an earthquake.

#### Procedures:

- Exit the building via the pre-planned shortest safe route.
- Report to designated assembly area.

### **SHELTER IN PLACE**

Used when personal safety is in danger if anyone leaves the building. Usually associated with an environmental hazard outside such as a gas leak, chemical spill, or wild animal near the building (e.g. cougar or bear).

#### Procedures:

- Return to building from outside and stay indoors.
- Continue normal activities within building.
- Close exterior doors and windows.
- Turn off ventilation and heat, tape window seams if applicable.
- DO NOT approach the site until clearance has been given by school district or emergency personnel.

### **HOLD AND SECURE**

Used to secure building because of an emergency situation outside such as a police incident (e.g. suspect pursued by police near building). Allows building to continue with the normal day but forbids outside activity and unnecessary room-to-room transit.

#### Procedures:

- Close and lock exterior doors and windows-monitor main entrance.
- DO NOT allow unauthorized personnel into building.
- Continue activities inside as per usual; limit internal movement if necessary.
- DO NOT approach the site until clearance has been given by school district or emergency personnel.

### **LOCKDOWN**

Used when there is an immediate and imminent threat to the building population. Most commonly implemented when the building has an active intruder.

#### Procedures:

- Close and lock exterior doors and windows, secure and barricade doors.
- Stay or gather into a secure room as quickly as possible.
- Turn out lights, pull shades.
- Get out of line of sight of doors and windows, hide, don't talk.
- Turn off and do not use cell phones.
- Normal activity ceases. Await police response.
- DO NOT approach the site until clearance has been given by school district or emergency personnel.

During an emergency we ask parents not to call the school as telephone lines may be needed for emergency communications. Please monitor school email and school or district websites for official information and updates.

### Secondary Academic Completion

(formerly known as “Remedial”)

July 13 to 30, 8:30-11:30AM or 12:00-3:00PM Daily

**Locations:** Gleneagle

**Courses:** Grades 9 & 10 English, Math, Science & Social studies.

These courses provide a path for students who achieved 40-49% in a course (during this 2020-2021 school year) to attain a passing grade. Students will be able to upgrade their mark to 50% (C-).

**These courses will follow a hybrid format:** Students will attend in-person for a Face-to-Face class once a week (either Thursday or Friday; you will be notified before the course starts as to which day you are to attend) and will attend online scheduled classes the other days.

**Registration for Remedial courses is by referral only, see website or your high school counsellor for details.** The referral form will collect some brief information from your teacher so we can customize your course to what you need to complete.

Morning classes: 8:30 – 11:30 am	Afternoon classes: 12:00 – 3:00 pm
English 9/10 (Composition and Literary Studies focus)	English 9/10 (Composition and Literary Studies focus)
Math 9	Math 10 (AW & FPC)

### Fast Track (High School Credit)

July 6 to August 11. Morning and Afternoon Courses available.

**Locations:** Gleneagle

**Courses:** Biology 11/12; Career Life Education 10; Chemistry 11/12; English 10,11,12; EAL 10/11\*; Mathematics 10,11; Physics 11,12; PE 10; Science 10; Social Studies 10/11.

(Environmental Sciences 11 will be a Face-to-Face course, available as part of SOYL program. See website for application details.)

**Fast Track courses this summer will follow a blended learning model:**

- Two weekly synchronous (online) class sessions
- One weekly in-person Face-to-Face class session on the weeks of July 12, 19, 26 and Aug. 2: All students must attend these Face-to-Face class sessions, which will include assessments/quizzes etc. Each student will be notified, in advance of the course start-up, as to which of these in-person days they will be required to attend.
- Online work & online tutorial support

This program is best suited for students wishing to complete the selected course within a 6 week timeline.
