RED DRESS DAY: TRIGGER WARNING: This message and its contents contain information relating to violence against Indigenous women, girls and 2SLGBTQQIA+ people, which may be triggering. Please take care of yourself and access the support resource provided, as needed.

RED DRESS DAY is an annual event held on May 5 in memory of the lives of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, and Two-Spirited (MMIWG2S) peoples across Canada. The day is intended to bring attention to the issue of missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls, and Two-Spirit peoples, particularly as a result of the legacy of colonialism, and to make positive change for safer communities. PMSS will be participating in this day through an installation of red dresses in the trees at the front of the school, on school property, as well as some indoor displays. We will also take time to pause and honour the MMIWG2S peoples in the morning that day.

Inspired by the work of Métis artist Jaime Black, this day draws attention to the MMIWG2S peoples in Canada. The colour red symbolizes the blood that connects all of us, as well as being a colour that calls the spirits of the Missing and Murdered back to their communities so that they may have "a chance to be among us and have their voices heard through their family members and community" (Black). Black also notes that the dresses are empty so that they remind viewers of the missing women, girls, and two-spirit peoples who should be wearing them. This day is about education and awareness as well as honouring the MMIWG2S people.

Please call the MMIWG2S Support Line 1-844-413-6649 if you or somebody you know needs help or support. This is national, toll-free support call line is available to provide support for anyone who requires assistance. This line is available free of charge, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SUMMER SCHOOL: International Education Summer School is now open for registration.
