

To officially start things off—on Thursday, June 13, from 5 to 9 pm—please come to our Reopening Night where visitors will be welcomed by traditional Coast Salish song and dance by Tsatsu Stalqayu Coastal Wolf Pack, plus remarks from invited speakers. Free admission for all.

Then, from Friday, June 14 through Sunday, June 16, we are hosting a full, extended weekend of familyfriendly fun for our Reopening Weekend Celebrations. Visitors will be treated to dance and music performances, hands-on workshops, staff tours, plus food trucks and half-priced admission.

The Museum's reopening in June will mark the successful completion of cutting-edge seismic upgrades to the iconic Great Hall, plus the revitalization and reinterpretation of displays of Northwest Coast Indigenous carvings, poles, weavings and other works from the past and present. Come see MOA, reimagined.

The Museum will reopen with two new feature exhibitions, both showcasing Indigenous perspectives of historical periods too often told and represented through a colonial lens: in Pursuit of Venus [infected] by famed Māori artist Lisa Reihana, and To be seen, to be heard: First Nations in Public Spaces, 1900–1965 curated by Karen Duffek and Dr. Marcia Crosby (Ts'msyen/Haida).
