Course Selection

While we are just about to start our second semester, the district is already into the planning stages for next year. At Port Moody, we recently concluded our acceptance of new IB applications and in February, we have a series of school events relating to student course planning, graduation planning, school transfer requests, and timetabling. Parent information sessions and student assemblies outlining the timelines and process for next year's course offerings will start the week of February 5th. A very important step in the process is receiving completed student request forms on February 13th. This information is then collated and we begin to build our timetable. During our student assemblies, we stress to make requests with one's personal high school pathway in mind (rather than peer based decisions) as it is difficult to make changes come September.

An added complexity to the timetabling process is the increasing number of students taking summer learning. To assist the office between now and June, please let your counsellor know when you register for a summer course that is the same as a course you requested with us for the following year. The summer program regularly communicates their registration information with us, but by directly letting us know we can make timely adjustments before the end of the school year.

I would like to remind families that when planning course pathways, we have an excellent resource in Mrs. Truax. She is our Career Resource Facilitator and students can get assistance in planning beyond high school by visiting the Career Centre; by accessing information from the *Career Centre* page on our website; and by following the channel on our app.

Cross Catchment

Cross catchment is the district process (Feb. 9th to 15th) for applying to a school outside of your neighbourhood catchment school. In order to request a September school change, you must be first registered at your catchment school and then submit an application to the district.
