Comparison of Grade 8 vs Grade 9

rade 8

- 40-minute classes with a flexible block schedule
- Less elective choices
- Core classes taught within a team of teachers sharing the same group of students
- Core courses taught Sept June
- 35 minute lunch closed campus (students not permitted to leave)
- Student learning is closely monitored by their teachers

Grade 9

- 77 minute classes (4 a day)
- 25 minute Flex block 4 times per week
- 8 Courses in total (4 each semester) that include 5 core courses and 3 elective choices
- Core classes taught by teachers in different departments
- Classes are everyday for 1 semester
 Semester 1 Sept. to Jan.
 Semester 2 Feb. to June
- 40-minute lunch Open campus after
 October 1 for grade 9s
- Students are more responsible for their own learning



rade 9 Course Selection


Students must take 8 courses



- All grade 9 students will take this class.
- Students will

 - Learn to protect their personal security and privacy of themselves and others
- Students will meet during: Core courses, Flex learning time, scheduled TEAMS meetings and have special topic assemblies.

Elective Courses

- ➤ Students will choose 3 electives from the rade 9 course list, and 2 alternatives. Three of open classes will be given to the student
- Electives are found in the online Course Programming uide
- ➤ If you are planning on attending university directly out of high school, you may have to take a second language up to grade 11
- > You do not require a second language to graduate or to go to college

Music/Choir/Musical Theatre





- Concert Band 9—In the timetable backed onto PE 9
- Concert Choir 9—offered outside the timetable, Rehearsals will be before/after school, schedule to be determined
- > String Orchestra 9—Tuesday/Thursday evenings
- ➤ **Jazz Band 9**—Will be before or after school, schedule TBD
- > Musical Theatre 10—will be afterschool.
