

STUDENT CLASS PLACEMENT

Placing students in the most appropriate class for an academic year is an important and complex process. We put a lot of consultation, care, and effort and into ensuring each student is best placed to meet their academic and social-emotional needs.



The class building process is a team effort. This team includes the principal, student services teachers, classroom teachers and non-enrolling teachers. This process is not finalized until after the first week of school in September, once an accurate enrollment has been determined. The following factors are considered when forming classes:

- adherence to BC Ministry of Education criteria
- needs of student services (EAL, learning support, EA supports)
- learning style and intellectual/social/emotional/physical needs
- student leadership
- social relationships
- grade and gender balance

Parent Information

The unique <u>educational, personal, medical or social needs of each child</u> are our priority in placement planning. Social and emotional needs are important to the success of a child in school, and each child's positive social connections are considered. Please note that parent information is not a request for specific placement, and requests for specific teachers cannot be considered. The final placement decision rests with the principal.

If you know of <u>significant</u> considerations relating to your child's educational needs, please outline them in an email directly to Mr. Killawee before the end of May.

We know there is sometimes anxiety and worry about starting a new school year. We ask you as parents to encourage and support your children in this. The goal is for each child to receive a placement that will best meet all of their needs. Fortunately, experience proves that the vast majority of students quickly accept their new placement, become involved and look forward to being part of a class community.
