**Welcome to November!** We are well into the school year already and much amazing learning has already occurred. Teachers are continuing to teach the revised Curriculum and are also continuing to learn along the way. Some subject topics have changed in each grade, but the most significant changes are the way

the curriculum is organized into teaching larger "Big Ideas", "Curricular Competencies", "Core Competencies" and "Content/Skills".

#### This was communicated throughout last year but here is quick a review of each:

**Big Ideas:** This is a starting place for a particular unit of study and is central to an area of learning. Example: "Natural Resources continue to shape the economy and identity of different regions of Canada" Gr. 5 Social Studies.

**Curricular Competencies:** These are statements about what the students are expected to *do*. Example: "Take stakeholders' perspectives on issues, developments and events by making inference about their beliefs, values, and motivations."

**Core Competencies:** These are sets of intellectual, personal and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop to engage in deeper learning. They are divided into three sections (Communication, Thinking and Personal & Social). Examples: "Acquire, interpret and present information (Communication); Generate ideas, analyze and critique, question and investigate (Thinking); Contributing to the community and caring for the environment (Personal & Social)".

**Content/Skills:** These are statements defining what the students are *expected to know*. Example: "Resources and economic development in different regions of Canada".

**Reporting:** Last month we sent home a copy of the Coquitlam School District reporting templates for each grade with some information attached. All of this should help clarify the formal report cards that will come home at the end of December.

Huge thanks to all families that were able to contribute non-perishable goods to our Me-2-We group's WE Scare Hunger campaign. We were able to donate hundreds of items to our local food bank which will help ensure a more positive upcoming holiday season for families in need.

The first two months have been a terrific start, thanks mostly to the huge effort of our fantastic group of teachers. I am extremely proud of the way our teachers have worked together to ensure your children a great start to the school year. In November we have our Remembrance Day Assembly, the Scholastic Book Fair, and our RC Mac Movie Night to look forward to. These activities and events are a testament to the dedication of our amazing staff and sensational parent community. Many thanks to all of the adults who generously donate their time to ensure these events are possible.

RC Mac is a sensational school and indeed as our motto says, "Together We're Better!"

### DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER

## WINTER WEATHER AHEAD!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partialdistrict closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified. The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather does change quickly. Therefore, when schools remain open, decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.
