SCHEDULES FOR NEXT YEAR & GRAD INFORMATION

Schedules for 2017/2018

Grade 9 students will be given their schedules on August 30th at the Grade 9 Preview Day. All other students have already seen their schedules for next year. Grade 10-12 students have already had a chance to change courses for September so their timetables are now final. **No course changes will be permitted for grade 10-12 students in September.** Only grade 9 students will be able to make course change requests in September.

Grade 12 marks and Post-secondary Admissions

The Ministry sends official copies of student's final marks in July to post-secondary institutions in order to complete the admissions process. The Ministry can send marks information only if a student has given them permission to do so. Students are required to complete the "Student Transcripts Service" on-line on the Ministry website. Many students have done this already. For those who have not, counsellors can provide instructions to students and parents but instructions are also available on the career centre web site. Students must make sure that they have completed this process prior to June 30th. Only students applying for a September 2018 entry need to complete the on-line STS form.



After Graduation

Your Dogwood (Graduation) Certificate will be sent directly to the school in the first week of August. Once they are signed and verified, an email will be sent out to indicate that they are ready to be picked from the school. These do not get mailed out.

Transcripts: one copy is mailed to the school for retention with your records, and one directly to your home. You should keep your official copy for yourself; do not give it to any post-secondary institutions you are applying to, instead have them make a photocopy of it. As well, the school will provide an official copy on your request. Dogwoods and transcripts are issued in your "legal" name by the Ministry.

It is very important that your mailing address, contact, email and phone information is up-to-date at school as this information is archived in your Ministry history. It is particularly important for International Students and any students leaving the country or province to leave a forwarding address with the school office and/or International Education.

Dear parent/guardian/student,

Grade 9 is the last year vaccines are offered in the school setting. Public Health encourages families to review their child's vaccine records to make sure all the provincially recommended vaccines have been received up to this age. Below is the list of recommended publicly funded 'school age' vaccines your child should have received by the end of Grade 9:

Vaccine	Complete series includes
Hepatitis B HealthLinkBCFile25a	2 doses (if 3 doses not received in infancy)
Meningococcal Quadrivalent Conjugate ACYW-135 vaccine HealthLinkBCFile23b	1 dose (if received in Grade 7 or later)
Varicella * (chickenpox) HealthLinkBCFile44b	2 doses *
HPV (grade 6 girls **) (human papillomavirus) HealthLinkBCFile101b	2 doses **
MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) HealthLinkBCFile14a	2 doses
Tdap *** (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) HealthLinkBCFile18c	1 dose ***

* If your child had lab confirmed chickenpox or shingles disease at 1 year of age or older they do not need varicella vaccine

** See [HealthLinkBCFile](#) for information on who can receive this vaccine for free

*** Your child should have received a series of Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, and Polio containing vaccine prior to school entry

Because of changes to the immunization schedule and recommended number of doses for varicella, your child may not have received a second dose of varicella vaccine.

If your child is missing any of the recommended immunizations, please contact your doctor, pharmacy, or local health unit to make an appointment. These immunizations are provided for free.

After Grade 9, recommended routine adult immunizations include Td (tetanus, diphtheria) every 10 years and influenza immunization annually. For more information on immunizations, please visit: www.fraserhealth.ca/immunizations
