Scholarship Application Preparation

Ms. Luddu and Ms. David are holding a scholarship session in early November. Stay tuned for Scholarship Session #2: in early November and Session #3: in April. The purpose of the first meetings are to explain the scholarship application process, deadlines for post-secondary applications, deadlines for major entrance scholarships at UBC & SFU, and to make students aware of other scholarships that are now open. Students are responsible for doing their own research with the guidance of Ms. Luddu and Mrs. David (Career Resource & Post-Secondary Facilitator). At this time of year, it is a good idea for students to begin their research and to request reference letters. More information can be found on the Riverside Website under the Career Resource Center link.

Peer Tutor Support

Tutors will soon be available for support in all academic areas and can meet with students outside of class time in a supervised location (counselling centre, classroom or school library). Tutor Reguest Forms are available on the school website and require both a student and parent email address. For the benefit of all, we ask that students commit to a minimum of 5 hours (over a number of days) before requesting a tutor. Request for peer tutors are on the Riverside web page.

Post-Secondary School Applications

Students should begin checking out application deadlines and confirming prerequisites for the schools of their choice. SFU and UBC have made big changes to their admission requirements. Counsellors have been encouraging students to check the post-secondary websites since the course selection process started last February. Douglas College will begin accepting on-line applications as of October 1st. The deadline to apply for entrance scholarship at UBC is Dec. 1, with all other applications due Jan. 15th. The deadline to apply for entrance scholarships at SFU is Dec. 15th with all other applications due Jan. 31. Keep in mind the school of businesses at UBC and SUU each have their own internal deadlines and supplementary applications. Eastern universities have earlier deadlines, generally before Christmas, so it is important to start researching now. PSAT Announcement

Students who may be planning to attend a college or university in the United States, or may possibly play athletics at SFU, are encouraged to write the PSAT in preparation to write the SAT. The SAT is required for students attending post-secondary in the States, and because SFU athletics participate in the NCAA the SAT is a requirement for their athletes.

The PSAT is identical to the SAT format but is intended for students in grade 11. However, grade 10 students, and grade 12s who have not previously written the PSAT are also invited to register. Students will receive a very detailed summary of how they performed on the test along with suggestions on where they need to improve in preparation for the SAT. See Mrs. Johal in the counselling department for information.

2019/2020 Language Challenge Exam

Students must complete an application <u>on-line</u>, print it, and bring the completed application form to the school counsellor. The application can be found on the counselling website. A sample of a completed application is available to view in the counseling area and posted on the counselling website. A \$50 cheque (which will be refunded when the test is written) should be included with the application along with a photograph... International students will include a check for \$155 which is non-refundable and a photo.

Completed application forms must be given to your counsellor by <u>November 1st.</u> The challenge exams will be held January 2020.

*Note: It is the student's responsibility to check post-secondary admission requirements or acceptance of challenge exam marks



Post-Secondary School Applications

Students should begin checking out application deadlines for the schools of their choice. Douglas College will begin accepting on-line applications as of October 1st, SFU is October 1st and deadline is January 31st, UBC is now open for applications and deadline is January 15th. Eastern Universities have earlier deadlines, generally before Christmas, so it is im-

portant to start researching now. Students wishing to be considered for Major Entrance Scholarships at SFU must apply by December 15th and UBC by December 1st

Career Life Connections 12 (CLC 12) course update:

Your child should have already attended their initial large group meeting with their CLC 12 teacher and should currently be setting times up to complete their first one-on-one meeting with them. We want the students to understand that **passing** this course is **a graduation requirement**; and while it is outside of the standard timetable, attendance at their scheduled meeting times is not only necessary, but essential to ensuring the success in their course.

We also would like to update you on some important information to changes and dates regarding the students' Capstone presentations as well as some deadlines for CLC 12 course that may impact school events:

1. **Option for students to present their Capstone in April rather than January.** Many students have come to us with fantastic ideas for their Capstones, but have been struggling already with the timeline that has been given. As a result, we have decided to open up the option to have their Capstone presentation to be shared in April. With that being said, it is still highly encouraged that students showcase their Capstone at our originally planned time during exam week in January. If your child is planning on graduating in January, they will be expected to present their Capstone during exam week in January.

2. All of the following must be completed and updated on their OneNote by mid November. If the assignments are not submitted by the deadline their ability to buy a Winter Formal ticket may be delayed.

- 30 Hours of volunteer/paid work & reflection
- Mock Job Interview (including the video uploaded) & reflection
- Vision Board
- Updated Resume
- Capstone Proposal (completed on OneNote)

You can help your child by reinforcing with your child that they **should be looking at their school email regularly** for information about the course. Please feel free to have a discussion with your child about the Capstone Project that they would like to propose to their CLC 12 teacher. Riverside Math Department to Coordinate "Take Our Kids to Work" 2019

On Wednesday, November 6th, the Riverside Math Department will coordinate Take Our Kids To Work (TOKTW) program. Take Our Kids to Work[™] is The Learning Partnership's signature program, now in its 25th year, that provides <u>Grade nine</u> students with the opportunity to experience and learn about the world of work as they begin to explore possible career paths. Research suggests that today's students will have multiple careers over the span of their working years. They will need to master both new technologies and complex social and organizational systems. They will also need to be prepared with the educational tools and experiences that will be necessary to succeed in tomorrow's workplace. All grade 9 students will spend a day at work with their parent, relative or friend of the family. Students will then be asked to complete a reflection sheet based on their experience that day. 

Did you know that every 30 seconds a child dies of severe acute malnutrition? While, here in Canada, 1 in 7 youth are considered obese. This year, Riverside Secondary School has pledged to improve both of these statistics by taking on the Move 4 Mana Initiative. Students will be asked to download the "Active for Good" app on their smartphones and the challenge will begin on October 16th. They will be given time to log

their physical activity for an entire month and will receive points depending on the intensity of their workouts. They can count their extra-curricular activities, gym classes or even their walks to school. For every 200 points that they earn a peanut butter base Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food packet (RUTF) will be donated to a child suffering from server acute malnutrition. For every 150 package donations, a life is saved. By improving our own well-being, we will be saving the lives of so many children in need, who are not likely to survive without this RUTF. IMPORTANT STUDENT SAFETY REMINDER REGARDING FIREWORKS AND FIRECRACKERS

At this time of year, we inevitably deal with incidents involving fireworks and firecrackers at school. We believe it is important to remind all students that possession of fireworks and firecrackers by minors is illegal and therefore contravenes the school district Code of Conduct. Students found to be selling or in possession of fireworks and firecrackers at school will be sent home on suspension.

At Riverside Secondary, we believe that we need to deal with the issue of illegal sales of fireworks to underage students and we are taking steps to address this issue within our community. We appreciate your support, as parents, in doing what you can to ensure that your child is not bringing fireworks or firecrackers to school. FIREWORKS & THE LAW IN PORT COQUITLAM

- Sales of all fireworks are banned within the City of Port Coquitlam
- You need a permit to set off fireworks in Port Coquitlam. Application must be made in person at the Tax Office at Port Coquitlam City Hall (2580 Shaughnessy St.)
- You must be at lease age 18 to handle or use fireworks
- Fireworks can only be discharged in certain places:
- On private property, with the occupant's consent, and
- At a public event run by a public body or society, with written permission.

HALLOWEEN COSTUMES
