LAST WELK OF SCHOOL

- Locker cleanout: Students should clean out lockers by June 21st. Everything should be out by the end of the day June 21st. On the morning of the last day of classes, Friday, June 21st, we have STREAM class and students will be asked to attach a tag to their lock, remove it, and bring to the STREAM teacher at 9:00am that day.
- Lost and Found: Will be on display starting now until June 21st. Please have your child check the table in the main foyer. Unclaimed items will be sent to a charity following June 21st.
- Grade 12 Students: Friday, June 21st will be an altered schedule for Grade 12s. Following a short 9 am STREAM class for locker clean-out and yearbook distribution, Grade 12s will attend periods 1 and 2 as scheduled. From 11:45 am 12:30 pm the Cafeteria will be reserved for Grade 12s to gather and sign yearbooks. A BBQ lunch will follow from 12:30 1:30 pm. After lunch, Grade 12s will move to the Gym for the mandatory Commencement Rehearsal which is scheduled to end at 2:30 pm. Grade 12s will be dismissed at the conclusion of the rehearsal. Caps and Gowns and Commencement tickets that were not collected on June 19th will be available for pick-up in the gym immediately following the rehearsal.

Yearbooks:

- A limited number of yearbooks are available for purchase. Please see Mrs. Gaucher in the office right away! Reminder that all other fees must be paid before you can purchase.
- Yearbooks will be handed out on June 21st during STREAM.

Information for Incoming Grade 9's:

- There will be an email coming out near the end of June with information about the start of the next school year. Stay tuned! We also post information to our website in case you worry that you're not receiving emails or that they might be heading to your spam folder.
- Important Dates:
 - Grade 9 Welcome Day: Thursday, August 29th from 10 am 12 pm (an email will be sent out with details)
 - First Day of School Tuesday, Sept 3rd, 2024: Grade 9s will attend for a 2 ½ hour session in the morning. (start time to be confirmed). Grade 10-12s will attend STREAM for a brief registration check-in at 1 pm (check website in August for updated times).

What supplies do I need for the start of the school year?

- All students are expected to have a binder with some loose-leaf paper (section dividers are a good idea) and some basic writing utensils (pen, pencil, and eraser). Some courses may require more specific supplies.

 Teachers will inform students of any course specific supplies.
- As a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) School, it is imperative that students come prepared with an appropriate electronic device at the start of the school year. Please refer to the following page for frequently asked questions and information on suggested device specifications. The school has a limited number of devices available for loan, based on demonstrated need. Students are asked to see their counsellor for an application form, should they need to borrow a laptop.

What kind of device will my child need?

The device your child brings will need to have a minimum of a 10-inch screen, as well as a keyboard. While we can support a variety of devices, we have some recommendations below:

- 1. We do not recommend iPads or Minis. The screens are too small, even with a keyboard. In addition, smart phones and data enabled watches are also not suitable devices for this program.
- 2. The district discourages Chrome Books and android tablets. They are unable/not optimized to run some of the software we use in the classroom.
- 3. Think about the size and weight of the device, as students will need to carry it to and from school each day. Protective cases are highly recommended.
- 4. Battery Life we encourage you to think about devices that have a longer battery life.
- 5. You do not need to buy a high-end device, but you may want to think about how many years you plan for your child to use this device. We have noticed an issue with devices that have limited Hard Drive Space.
- 6. Students in the district all get Office 365 for free. You do not need to purchase any software.
- 7. We highly recommend students bring a mouse when bringing in a laptop.
- 8. We are a Windows 10 district, and many students have greater success on Windows 10 or 11 devices.



NOTICE OF CHANGE IN BUS SERVICES FOR FALL 2024

Coast Mountain Bus Company (CMBC) has advised that bus service will be changing slightly, effective **Tuesday** September 3rd, 2024.

There will be no schedule change, though the routing will change slightly as shown in the image below.



2024-2025 STUDENT COURSE SCHEDULES

Student Schedules for next year will be published to the MyEd portal the last week of June. You will receive an email to advise you to check the currently scheduled courses and complete a course change request form for any of the following issues – listed in order of priority that counsellors will address and work through to make changes:

- Grade 12 students with missing or incorrect courses required for graduation (i.e. minimum of 7 courses + CLC)
- Grade 12 students with missing or incorrect courses required for post-secondary admissions
- Grades 9-11 students with incomplete or incorrect courses
 - o Grades 10 and 11 students minimum of 8 courses
 - Grade 9 students minimum of 8 courses + Applications of Digital Literacy 10
- Grades 9-11 students with imbalanced timetables (i.e. all academic courses scheduled in one semester)

Schedules will be published to MyEd again at the end of August. Remaining issues will be addressed starting the week of August 26th when counsellors return, including course changes due to completion of coursework at summer school.

The only way to request a change is through the course change request form. Do not email counsellors for course changes. The link for the form will be included in the email that you will receive notifying you that the schedule has been published in MyEd.

INFORMATION FOR 2024 GRADUATES

Grade 12 Marks and Post-Secondary Admissions

The Ministry sends official copies of student's final marks in July to post-secondary institutions in order to complete the admissions process. The Ministry can send marks information only if a student has given them permission to do so. Students are required to complete the "Student Transcripts Service" on-line on the Ministry website. Many students have done this already in early spring. For those who have not, counsellors can provide instructions to students and parents, but instructions are also available on the Career Centre web site. **Students must make sure that they have completed this process prior to June 30th.** Only students applying for a September 2024 entry need to complete the on-line STS form.

After Graduation

Your **Dogwood (Graduation) Certificate** will be sent directly to the school sometime during August. Dogwoods and transcripts are issued in your "legal" name by the Ministry. You will receive an email from the school when they are ready to be picked up – the school office is open throughout the summer. We **DO NOT** mail these out to you.

Transcripts: one copy is mailed to the school for retention with your records, and one directly from the Ministry of Education to your home. You should keep your official copy for yourself; do not give it to any post-secondary institutions you are applying to - instead have them make a photocopy of it. As well, the school will be able to provide an official copy on your request. You can also update the BC Transcript Service with your updated permissions for institutions to view your records.

It is very important that your mailing address, contact, and phone information is up to date at school not only while attending but also afterwards, so that documents can be mailed to the correct address. Please check your MyEd Portal to confirm that we have the correct information. If changes are necessary, please email lcorcoran@sd43.bc.ca or see Mrs. Corcoran in the office. It is particularly important for International Students and any students leaving the country or province to leave a forwarding address with the school office and/or International Education.






Looking Ahead At River's Edge Theatre!



Coquitlam River Watershed Roundtable

Demonstration Rain Garden

What is a Rain Garden?

Rain gardens are a beautiful and natural strategy to improve water quality in the lower Coquitlam River watershed by reducing the impact of stormwater runoff. Stormwater runoff in developed areas can introduce toxins, degrade water quality, and alter nutrient levels of water flowing to the Coquitlam River.



Demonstration Rain Garden at Lions Park, Port Coquitlam

Rain gardens mitigate these effects by:

- temporarily storing stormwater runoff during heavy rain and flood events
- removing and filtering pollutants from run-off
- providing habitat for native plants, birds and beneficial insects
- replenishing groundwater and returning clean water to streams and rivers

In 2021 the Coquitlam River Watershed Roundtable volunteers installed a demonstration rain garden in Lions Park, Port Coquitlam. While the rain garden will eventually become self-sustaining, during its first several years, plants will require watering over the summer months.

How can you help?



Spend a pleasant summer morning or evening watering the plants in the rain garden at Lions Park. Instructions and watering equipment are available to volunteers who sign up here.

Did your child receive the MMR vaccine?

Measies cases are being reported in many places internationally, in Canada and in B.C. We would like to remind you to check your child's vaccination records before travelling during Spring Break to ensure they are protected.

Measies is a serious illness caused by the measies virus. It is very contagious. It can spread easily through air.

Symptoms of measies include fever, cough, runny nose, and inflamed eyes that are often sensitive to light. These symptoms are followed by a rash, which starts on the face and neck and spreads to the chest, arms and legs.

Measies can cause complications like inflammation of the brain (encephalitis), which can lead to seizures, deafness or brain damage. Other complications can include ear infection, diarrhea, pneumonia and death. This is why protection by vaccination is so important.

Getting your child vaccinated on schedule is the best way to protect them from this preventable infection. The MMR vaccine is recommended for all children and is provided free in B.C.

In B.C., measies vaccine is given as a series of 2 doses.

- First dose is given as the measies, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine on a child's first birthday.
- Second dose is given around the time of starting school (at 4 to 6 years) as the measles, mumps, rubella and varicella (MMRV) vaccine.

All school-age children and teens who have not been vaccinated should get 2 doses.

If you plan on traveiling internationally:

- Bables between 6 months and 1 year should get vaccinated against measies before travelling internationally. This dose is not included in the routine two doses but will add to protection against measies while travelling.
- Children between 1 and 4 years can also get their second dose early if they are travelling internationally before they are due at age 4.

Make sure your child's immunization records are up-to-date

Check your child's immunization records by

- Scanning the QR code to Health Gateway
- Going online to <u>healthqateway.qov.bc.ca</u>
- Using the Health Gateway app

If your child's online record shows their vaccines are not up-to-date but they did get vaccines from a health care provider outside of public health, please:

- Contact the health care provider who immunized your child and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
- Report these immunizations to Public Health online by either scanning this QR code or going online to <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform</u>. This will prevent children from missing school in the event of a measles case.

if your child has not yet had their vaccines, please make an appointment with a public health unit, family doctor or nurse practitioner. Children 4 years or older, as well as adults, can also be vaccinated in pharmacles. Not all family doctors, nurse practitioners, or pharmacles offer vaccines, so make sure to call ahead and check.
