Grade 12 marks and Post-secondary Applications

Student Transcripts Service (STS)

Instructions for Grade 12 students

Students who are graduating this year and are applying to post-secondary schools for a September entry must submit STS information to the Ministry on-line. Students should complete this as soon as possible. If the process is not completed students are responsible for getting their final marks to post-secondary institutions on their own.

Access the Ministry website www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca

1. Students must register for a BC Government account, a **BCeID**. Follow the system prompts and register for STS. Finally log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using the BCeID.
2. From a student's STS Dashboard make post-secondary institution selections, view transcript, view assessment results, and send transcripts immediately.

SCHEDULE FOR JANUARY 2019 – END OF SEMESTER

The end of **Semester 1** at Riverside is fast approaching! In order to help students and parents navigate this busy time of year, please refer to the information bullets and schedule below.

- The last day of regular classes will be **Friday, January 18th**. The following week students will be involved in Assignment work time (if necessary), exams, Graduation Transitions interviews (Grade 12's) and/or Grade 9 interviews.
- The **Provincial Numeracy Exam** is mandatory for graduation **for grade 10 students presently registered in Math 10 (Semester 1)** who have not previously written a Math 10 Provincial exam. Please check the schedule below to find which day you will be writing the numeracy exam and in which classroom (organized by name). Students who missed writing the Numeracy assessment last year **NEED** to write it this year. Online calculators are provided on the electronic section of the numeracy exam.
- Students taking a Math 10 course in semester 2 will write the Numeracy exam in June.
- Students should bring picture ID to any provincial examination.
- Please note that students may not begin exams any later than 30 minutes after the official start time.
- Grade 12 Graduation Transitions exit Interviews (for all first semester English 12 students) and Grade 9 interviews (all) will be held in RAP classrooms.

WINTER WEATHER AHEAD



Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other weather conditions. All schools in the Coquitlam School District will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Some of our schools are in very different climate zones from one another and there may be the need for select closings within the district. If there is a partial closure of schools within the district, these individual schools will be identified.

On occasion, full district or partial district closure is required.

Extreme weather can also impact transit bussing. Bus schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit bus schedules need to consult the Translink website: <http://www.translink.ca/>

Any district-wide or partial closure will be decided by 6:30 a.m. at the latest and will be announced via **School District 43: website www.sd43.bc.ca** and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs before 6:30 a.m. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements, should schools be closed. Please do not call the school just to find out if they are open. While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather changes quickly and therefore decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.



Valedictorian

Potential candidates who are interested in valedictorian must have Honour Roll status and be in good behavioural standing. All candidates should enjoy public speaking, as their responsibilities lie in bringing the grad class together through community and personal achievements. They should also be interested in not just talking about how life has been to this point, but also adding perspective in guiding everyone to critically think about their future after high school. I always tell them they need to make the audience laugh and cry through the power of words.

Process

Students interested in being a valedictorian should indicate their interest to a teacher that they trust to nominate them for the valedictorian process. Teachers will put forward students who have expressed an interest in being a valedictorian as well.

- Students must have Honour Roll status and are in good behavioural standing.
- Once those students are put forward, a committee of teachers will evaluate all the candidates to ensure that they meet the criteria.
- All candidates will then meet with Mr. Hyde, Mr. Purdy and Mr. Barrington to ensure that they are aware of the expectations of being selected as the valedictorian and salutarian.
- Students will then commit to either proceeding or not the next day after the meeting. If they do not check -in then it will be assumed that they are not interested in being valedictorian.
- If a student expresses interest in being a valedictorian, then the students will create a profile that highlights their 4 or 5 best achievements at Riverside Secondary.
- At a staff meeting, teachers will then rank the candidates based on the profiles shown. Only the top 6, based on teacher's ranking will be able to create a persuasive video that will be shown in RAP. An alternative option for the potential candidate is for them to perform live in front of their peers. This would have to be on a specific day and not conflict with the regular schedule.

Students will vote on their valedictorian and salutarian. Every two weeks, the two will check in with Mr. Barrington, Mr. Hyde and Mr. Purdy who will mentor them in terms of crafting their speech. This will all start in April and conclude in May.
