#### Valedictorian/Toastmaster – New Process



Students who are interested in becoming a valedictorian or toastmaster will need to do the following:

- 1. Complete the valedictorian form. They will need to get three teachers and ten students to endorse them as a candidate. Teachers can encourage students who have expressed an interest in being a valedictorian as well.
- 2. Once the form is complete, a small committee meets to review the candidates.
- 3. If a candidate is approved, the students will have the go ahead to create a video that will be posted on Riverside's social media sites to introduce themselves to the student body and highlight why they would be a good candidate.
- 4. Students would then perform a 1.30 min. speech in front of their grad class. The speech will be a final pitch to convince the grad class that they will give the best speech at commencement. This allows the student body to see how that person can deliver a speech.

Criteria for selection prior to running as a valedictorian.

- Students must have Honour Roll status and are in good behavioral standing.
- They must demonstrate that they have been an active participant in the Riverside community.

Once those students are put forward, a committee of teachers will evaluate all the candidates to ensure that they meet the criteria.

After the selection of the valedictorian, all candidates will then meet with the administration and Mr. Barrington to ensure that they are aware of the expectations of being selected as the valedictorian and toastmaster. Students will then commit to either proceeding or not the next day after the meeting. Students will vote on their valedictorian and toastmaster.

#### Valedictorian

Once the valedictorian(s) are selected, then every two weeks, the valedictorian will check in and be mentored by Mr. Barrington, who will mentor them in terms of crafting their speech for commencement. If they do not check-in, then it will be assumed that they are not interested in being the valedictorian. Arrangements can be made for a new valedictorian if this happens. This will all start in April and conclude in May.

#### **Toastmaster**

Once selected, they will be meeting with the grad committee and Ms. Chin. They will be crafting a speech that will address their peers at the grad dinner and dance. They will not be presenting their speech at Commencement. If they do not check-in, then it will be assumed that they are not interested in being the salutatorian. Arrangements can be made for a new toastmaster if this happens.

### Riverside Bamfield Trip 2024

This spring (Feb 2024) Riverside Secondary and the Science Department are fortunate to be able to offer students an amazing opportunity to participate in a truly memorable and worthwhile multi-day field trip to the Bamfield Marine Science Centre (BMSC) (<a href="www.bms.bc.ca">www.bms.bc.ca</a>) located on the West Coast of Vancouver Island. The BMSC is a world class facility funded by a consortium of Western Canadian universities and dedicated to the study and conservation of marine life. The students will be exposed to hands on marine biology, guided by marine biologists in a part of the west coast of BC renowned for its pristine ocean shore and tidal pools. Students will also experience a two hour boat excursion to the Deer Group Islands on the MV Alta, which also includes sampling from the sub tidal environment and marine mammal and bird observation. The trip is a truly once in a lifetime opportunity. Accommodation will be in the dormitories at BMSC, and all meals are provided in the cafeteria which overlooks Barkley Sound. If Interested please see Ms. Mireau to get your name on our list! There are only 22 spots for this once is a lifetime opportunity. Only school groups and university students in specific courses can use this facility as it is not open to the public.

The cost of this trip is approximately \$900.00 for 4 days.

This deposit cheque of \$450 is due by Sept 26<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The remaining \$450 will be due Jan 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Cheques can be made out to Riverside Secondary.



## Protect children from respiratory illnesses this winter

Respiratory illnesses tend to increase as we spend more time indoors. Common colds, the flu and COVID-19 spread through tiny droplets as people who are sick <u>breathe</u>, talk, cough or sneeze. When other people touch these droplets and then their eyes, <u>mouth</u> or nose before washing their hands they may become sick.

There are a handful of steps both children and adults can take to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based sanitizer if soap and water is not available.
- · Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth and nose.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- . If you have symptoms, stay home and stay away from people at higher risk of serious illness.



The best way to protect others and reduce the risk of getting sick with the flu and COVID-19 is to get <a href="immunized">immunized</a>. The flu and COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and available for free to anyone aged six months and older.

It is much safer to get the vaccines than to get the illnesses. Register your children with the Get Vaccinated system so that you can be invited to book their vaccinations when they are due.
