COUNSELLING SERVICES

STUDENT SERVICES

Students served by school-based support services are those students who require an individual education plan. They have a wide variety of learning needs which may include: gifted and talented; visual, hearing, physical or chronic health impairments; speech and language disorders; learning disabilities; behaviour disorders; English Language Learning; and/or social/emotional difficulties.

The focus of school-based support services is to enable students to become active participants in their learning experiences and to continue developing to their potential. Referrals for school-based support services are made via school Counsellors to the school-based team.

CLUBS & TEAMS

The organization of clubs is based on student interest and staff sponsorship. Students are encouraged to become involved in extra-curricular activities. Participation in activities outside the classroom helps to make the secondary school years more enjoyable and rewarding. 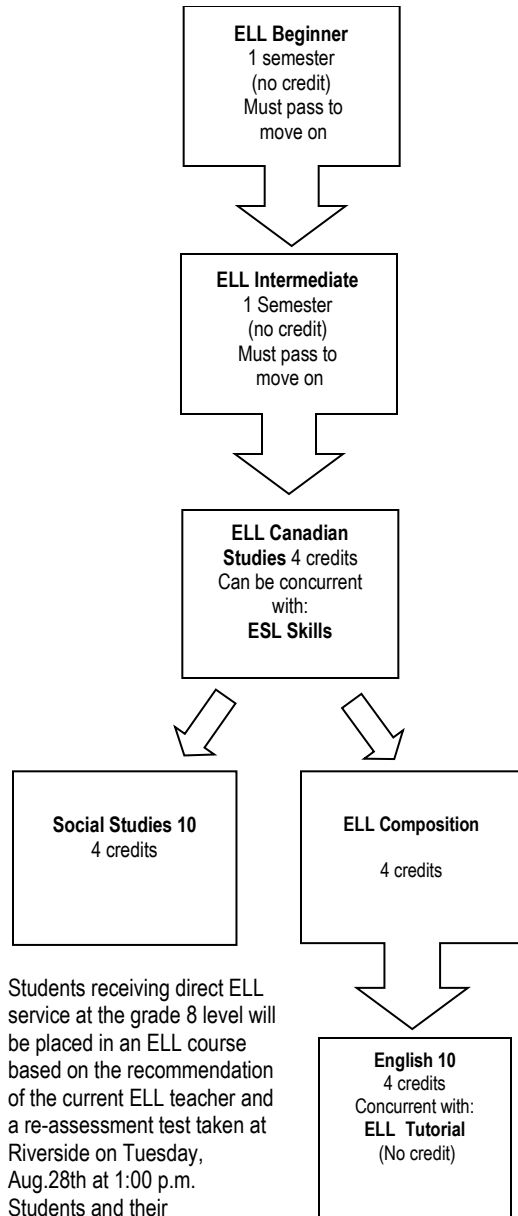

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING



Students receiving direct ELL service at the grade 8 level will be placed in an ELL course based on the recommendation of the current ELL teacher and a re-assessment test taken at Riverside on Tuesday, Aug. 28th at 1:00 p.m. Students and their parents/guardians are invited to attend an orientation including lunch on Tuesday, Aug. 28th @ 11:30 a.m.

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

Specialty programs allow students of similar abilities and interests to work together in a challenging environment. Entry into these programs require application and/or assessment tests as space is limited. Courses offered to grade 9 students are:

Mathematics 9 Honours

This course covers the learning outcomes from the Principles of Math 9 at an accelerated pace to allow time for enrichment and preparation for math contests. Along with excellent math skills, students must be highly motivated with good study habits.

Science 9 Honours

Capable and enthusiastic students have the opportunity to take Science 9 in an enriched setting. Students must be highly motivated with good study habits.

Leadership 10

Designed for students interested in developing leadership, communication and team-building skills, students will have opportunities to organize a variety of school activities. Experience gained in leadership can lead to scholarships.

Hockey Academy

Open to all skill levels, the class will be conducted on the ice at PoCo Arena and at Riverside. A fee of \$224 monthly includes ice time, coaching and academy athletic wear. Students must provide their own equipment. A Hockey Academy open house will be held on February 6th at 7:00 p.m. at Riverside for more information.

Digital Immersion 9

Digital Immersion is a program which provides students the opportunity to use their laptop computer to facilitate learning both at school and at home. Students in the program will stay together as a cohort with a core team of teachers for their "computer immersion" courses of English, Social Studies, Science and Digital Applications. Students interested must possess a strong work ethic and a high degree of responsibility and have their own laptop computer. Arrangements can be made for those who are unable to provide their own equipment to rent a school laptop for a nominal fee. Students will not be denied access to this program due to financial need.

A language 11 is required for direct entry into most universities but is neither a graduation requirement nor a college entrance requirement. SFU accepts Introductory Language 11 for entrance.

SEMESTER AND LINEAR COURSES

At Riverside, you will find that some courses are a semester (five months) long, and some are linear (all year). Semestered courses meet every day and linear courses meet every second day. Sometimes, Grade Nine students find it challenging to adjust to the semester system and find themselves falling behind quickly. We encourage students to stay on top of their work at the beginning of Grade Nine, and to see their teachers and/or counsellors for help early in the course if they are experiencing difficulty. Leaving things too late in a semestered course may make it difficult to get caught up before the end of the semester.
