The purpose of the MDI is to learn about the health and well-being of students 9-12 (grade 4 and grade 7 students are asked to take part). School Closure due to Inclement Weather

As the weather begins to get colder, it is important to keep you informed about school closures. As a general expectation, schools will remain open. If extreme weather conditions cause you to be unsure or if local conditions are unsafe, you may keep your child at home or arrange for an early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations (CKWX news 1130; CKNW 980) early in the morning. If schools in the district are closed for the day, you will be able to find out on our district webpage (www.sd43.bc.ca) by 7:00am (at the latest).

If there is an accumulation of snow, please remember to dress students in clothing suitable for playing in the snow, to avoid disappointment and cold fingers. Snow pants and boots are always a great idea and don't forget an extra pair of gloves or mitts. Please be sure that even on those wet days (when schools are not closed) that you make sure that your children are dressed appropriately for the weather as we will be outside as often as possible. We want students to come to school prepared for the outdoors in much the same way we expect them to be prepared to learn indoors.

While we do our best to make sure that salt is on the ground on these colder days, please remind your children to be careful in the mornings as it can be very slippery, especially on wood and leaves. Cement can also be misleading, especially at the back of the school, where less sunlight gets through (especially in the early morning hours).

Christmas Concert

We are requiring parent help with make up for our cast members for the afternoon and evening concert performances. Please contact Mrs. Cox (gcox@sd43.bc.ca) if you are able to assist for either performance.

I have also include an attachment with this newsletter about the clothing for students for the concert. Please be sure to have a look so that you know the colours that your child is to wear.

<u>Concert tickets will be coming home this Friday</u>, <u>December 7th</u>. We will take care to ensure that the tickets are secured and in student planners / take home folders. They will be provided via family mail (which means that if you have more than one child at the school, your eldest child will have them).

<u>Each family will receive four tickets (in total) to the concert - two for the afternoon performance</u>. If you would rather have a different combination of tickets you are welcome to trade with other parents or families. Any trades will need to be initiated and done by parents / guardians. If you will not be using all of your tickets, please let other parents know so that they may be redistributed and used by others. While we want to be able to have as many parents attend the concerts as possible, we also have to consider the safety of everyone in attendance (the gym can get really full). Typically, the afternoon performance has fewer people than the evening performance. We encourage parents to attend the dress rehearsal on Wednesday as well. Tickets are not required for this performance.

As in years past, we are asking that you please do not bring strollers to the concert. The gym is already going to be full, and there will be no space for extra items.

Because the school will not be keeping specific track of tickets that have been traded, it is imperative that you bring all tickets with you when you attend either of the performances on December 13th (afternoon and evening). They will be checked at the door and if you do not have them, you will not get in.

As in years past, we will be collecting non-perishable food items for the SHARE Food Bank for both the afternoon and evening performances. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

Finally, for the evening concert on Dec. 13, cast members should be at the school by 6:00pm (they will meet in the library) and all other students should be in their classrooms by 6:30pm (classroom doors will be locked until 6:30). Students may wait with their parents in the lineup until the classroom doors are opened.

There will be more information to follow as we get closer to the performances. Information about our Adopt-a-Family program will soon be sent out as well as the plan for the front row of seating. Please note that all money raised goes toward helping other less fortunate families in the Tri-Cities.

Food Donations to SHARE

Our kindergarten elves and I went to all the classrooms on Monday to remind them about our food drive. Starting today (and for the next two weeks) we will be collecting non-perishable food items from each of the classrooms. Once all items have been collected, we will be sorting them. If you wish to donate

food items, please have your children take food items to their classrooms and we will take care of the rest! You are also free to place any items in the appropriate boxes that are in the front hallway.

As mentioned earlier in the newsletter, we will have boxes at the afternoon and evening Christmas concert performances so that if you wish to bring any non-perishable food items with you to the concert, there will be a place to put them.
