• Challenging week with exposure letters

-email to highlight what school is doing to keep school safe

-attendance dropped last week but slowly coming up this week

-community support

-students are happy and positive

-the LAST exposure was NOT a member of our community

- Fraser Health would notify us if concern around transmission within cohorts- but they have NOT said that- no cluster or transmission/ no further safety protocols added by FH

-Spring weather- teachers bringing lessons outdoors

-will continue to do all we need to do to keep kids at school

-Report Cards- out next week WEDNESDAY / reporting more challenging this year, more time consuming, everything taking alot longer, gradual transition students requires full reporting this term

-parents can still contact teachers if they have questions before Spring Break

-Multi- Year Technology Plan- PAC purchased 35 Ipads 5 years ago- school bought 30

- what will meet the needs for staff moving forward ?

- some support from district / subsidy

-when turn in an old one \$100 each (18 to replace this year)

- issue is with IPADs- Ipad conversion difficulty in district/ apps

- district suggests eliminate all 32 GB ipads-> 128 GB for \$160 (order through district with discount)

- DISTRICT WIDE conversion

- how many ipads school wants? How many laptops?

- Ipad cart can be signed out for  $\frac{1}{2}$  day per teacher / have special disinfectant wipes for cleaning before transferred to next class

- mobile lab format - more flexibility, used all the time

- Can PAC support school with ipad/computer updates? Current ones will not be able to use for next year/ need upgraded

-survey Teachers to ask what will help meet their needs in terms of tech (ipad/laptop)

- waiting on \$ amount / add this onto budget - yearly contribution

-65 ipads/ 35 need replacing

-PAC approval and info in APRIL

- Starting Jogging Club in April / creating a plan and schedule for classes

- Track & Field- no district meets

- Track Attack- integrate into PE class/ stations with learning group / building skills but no stats required for competition

- Alot of positives happening at the school during this time: less garbage, less washroom mess, students following all protocols, less balls on the roof of the school, many sinks in the school for easy and fast transition of hand washing, outdoor classroom doors, students outside rain or shine...
