Hi Anita.

I am pleased to let you know that our scholarship committee has selected **Amelia Wai** as this year's Riverview Park Elementary Scholarship recipient. I hope that you and the PAC will agree with us that Amelia is an excellent choice.

Amelia attended Riverview Park from Kindergarten all the way to grade 5. She is an outstanding student, maintaining an average of approximately 94%, and will be pursuing a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology at the University of British Columbia, Vancouver. Currently she is thinking about a career in Occupational Therapy. Amelia is kind, respectful, and very well rounded with many different interests: While she describes herself as an introvert, she stepped out of her comfort zone and joined our school's debate club, and she participated in a nationwide Accounting case competition where she had to present virtually in front of judges and other students from all across Canada. All throughout high school, Amelia has also been an active member of our school's Students 4 Students club (in support of underprivileged students in Zimbabwe), Paws for a cause (supporting an animal shelter), and the VIVA club (in support of local hospitals) which all three are serving charities through their various fundraising and awareness activities. Outside of school she plays the piano and participates in Taekwondo. Amelia also volunteered for community events, such as Festival Du Bois and Lights at Lafarge. She has been working part-time with the Architecture Centre for Excellence, Shared Services Canada since July 2022, where she produces videos and edits website content.

Amelia shared some memories of her time at Riverview Park during the scholarship application process:

"I attended Riverview Park Elementary School (RVP) when I was 5 years old in kindergarten all the way to Grade 5. RVP is where I created many of my oldest friendships and precious memories, which I still remember many years later. After school, I attended the daycare and had a lot of time to bond with my peers and teachers. I remember the big assemblies, festive events and movie nights in the gym as well as the Terry Fox runs we did around the field and participating in the track and field events at Town Centre Park. Moreover, I cherished my time in the Lunchbox Theatre Program acting in two plays, Annie and the Lion King. The engaging, friendly and active atmosphere of RVP is what motivates me today to respect my peers and teachers with the golden rule to "treat others the way you want to be treated," and to support my community with volunteer work."
