# Principal's Message

We have had a busy February at RVP and I know that March is just going to fly by as we are in the home stretch to Spring Break. There is something so wonderful about the longer and warmer days and seeing some of the spring flowers start to emerge from their winter hibernation. The birds are chirping and the frogs are croaking to welcome the new season.

Over the past year, the staff at RVP have been working on re-branding our school logo to better reflect the historical significance of the lands surrounding our school community. The Riverview Lands have been renamed səmiqwə?elə (pronounced Suh-MEE-kwuh-EL-uh), in recognition and respect of the Kwikwetlem First Nation's (kwikwəñəm) historical and cultural ties to its ancestral land. This name was given by the kwikwəñəm people based on memories of how the land was once widely used as a roosting ground for the great blue heron, due to its proximity to what was then the floodplain of the Coquitlam River.

At Riverview Park Elementary, we have adopted the mascot of the Great Blue Heron and have rebranded our school logo to reflect this new direction. I wanted to extend a huge thank you to Mr. Blake Nguyen, a parent volunteer and graphic artist, who has spent countless volunteer hours throughout this school year working on creating our new school logo. You can see the submark logo sample on the header of this newsletter and the full colour logo on the very last page. We are thrilled to have this new imagery to represent our school community. Thank you so much, Blake!

# <u>School Supplies and Planner Fees – Overdue</u>

Just a reminder that if you have not already paid for your child's school supplies and planner, these items are available for purchase via School Cash Online and are now overdue. The total cost of school supplies for the year, per student, is \$45 and the total cost for planners is \$10 per student. In addition to covering the cost of planners, the fee for school supplies covers the cost of all learning and instructional materials for the entire school year for your child – notebooks, pencils, erasers, scissors, felt markers, crayons, craft paper, craft supplies, glue, rulers, etc. We try to keep supply costs to a minimum through our bulk ordering approach – there are many schools who charge much more for supplies annually.

I am hopeful that all outstanding school supplies and planners fees are paid for as soon as possible. If you require financial assistance to cover some or all the cost of supplies and/or the planner, please contact either myself or your child's teacher directly. As a school, we are required to pay for all the ordered supplies and planners at the time the items are received by the school, which is in the Fall of each school year. Since we have already paid all these fees for all students, there are budget challenges for our school as we try to set aside funds to cover other costs that arise throughout the school year. Your immediate attention to the issue of outstanding fees is greatly appreciated. Again, if you require financial assistance, please let me know.

# **Drop-Off and Pick-Up Safety Reminders**

Please review the following important safety rules and please help us keep all our children safe by following these rules every day, even when you are in a hurry.

- 1. <u>Pick-Up/Drop-Off Lane</u>: Please remain at your vehicle at all times during pick-up and drop-off when in the pick-up/drop-off lane.
- 2. <u>Parking and Round-About</u>: The five parking spots in the round-about are the only places where parking is permitted. At no time are parents permitted to leave their cars in the round-about area and students are not to be taken to the cars that are waiting in this area. When waiting in the round-about, cars are to proceed to the pick-up lane when space becomes available.

- 3. <u>Through Lane</u>: Please do not drop students off or pick students up while stopped for traffic in the through lane. Cars pull out quickly and unexpectedly and this is a concern for student safety.
- 4. <u>Street Parking Option</u>: Avoid the congestion all together and park on one of the streets close to the school and walk the rest of the way.

Thank you very much for your support of these important safety rules during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up.
