## **Intellectual Development**

Goal: Literacy - incease phonemic awareness K-5

#### Rationale:

We need a third year to focus on literacy in order to deepen our understanding of our existing programs and resources, and to find common resources for intermediate learners.

#### Planned Actions:

- -Continue and strengthen literacy committee (must have representation from intermediate and primary)
- -Continue prioritizing LST time for daily co-planned guided reading groups (French and English)
- -Re-engage district literacy support teachers (Karla Allen, Jaqueline F, Rosalita F) in order to help grade group teams identify their most pressing need in Fall 2025
- -Fall assessment (may include comprehension and Lexia). Determine spring assessment

#### Indicators of Success:

- -Teams set grade level focus in the Fall of 2025.
- -Literacy committee will be able to see success by listening to team conversation during staff meetings, team meetings.
- -Track and measure results with CBA and phonological assessments
- -Spring assessment. Discuss in May pro-d day

#### School Community Engagement Process:

-More family reading. Maintain connection with volunteers (Maillard, Centennial, CABE buddies) for reading Internal buddies - intermediate/primary (French and English)

## **Human and Social Development**

#### Area of focus:

Rochester 'Roots' plan. As a school community, we will continue deepening our understanding of our shared values, bringing them to life in the classrooms, hallways and playground.

#### Planned Actions:

We spent 2045-25 familiarizing our school community with our 5 value words; Belonging, Respect, Care, Inclusion, Service. We will ensure that each of our 10 staff meetings allow time for reflection, sharing and learning. Continue mentioning the value words on the daily announcements and post in the weekly newsletter. Tie our recognition assemblies to the values, and our daily 'tickets' for prizes over the announcements when we see evidence of our values in action.

#### Indicators of Success:

We will know we are successful when staff conversations go deeper than we currently do. We need to keep tying values into student learning activities - not only in family groups, but also with homeroom teachers.

#### Planned Actions:


We will continue to find ways to connect Indigenous ways of learning with our students and families. This year we wrote a school wide poem honouring storytelling and culture with our communities. We will build on this next year.

#### Indicators of Success:

Celebrating storytelling and history helped create an ideal learning environment in June, where we spent four weeks learning Indigneous art, games, drumming, music, stories, and sport. We hosted a guest called 'Wild Moccasin Dancers' and have already booked Peter White, an Indigenous dancer from Burnaby for June 19, 2026 to teach us how dancing is "medicine".

#### School Community Engagement Process:

We included all members of the community this year through the creation of a school wide poem "where i'm from". Each staff member and each student wrote a poem to celebrate their culture and history. These poems were proudly displayed in our hallways and class poems on our multicultural wall.
