#### **School Closure Days**

This year there are a total of six school closure days. Four are attached to the Spring Break period in March, with the other two are in November and February respectively. The dates of these closures changes from one year to the next but have been in place since 2010. At that time, the District embarked on a calendar approval process and invited feedback from parents and other partner groups. The result was a school calendar designed around a consistent 180 instructional days each year with the length of school days adjusted to meet mandated ministry instructional hours. Depending upon the particular calendar year and when Spring Break occurs, there may be one, two or no extra closure days outside of the Spring Break period. This year, there happens to be two days closure days other than at Spring Break. The next closure day is on Friday, November 10. Please note that the following Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup> is a Provincial Statutory day and schools and government offices are closed.

## **MDI is coming for Grade 4's**

The MDI (Middle Years Development Instrument) is a self-report survey that is completed by students in grade 4 to gather information about their lives inside and outside of school. To develop a survey that children during the middle-childhood years are able to use to record their perceptions of their own health and well-being, a research team comprised of university researchers and community members reviewed more than 500 measures assessing dimensions of child well-being. The survey uses a developmental assets/strengths-based approach to assess five dimensions of children's psychological and social lives. The five dimensions include: Social and Emotional Development, Connectedness, School Experiences, Physical Health and Well-Being, and Constructive Use of Time.

Rochester grade 4 students will participate in the MDI in early November. This survey is developed by UBC and is not associated with the Ministry of Education's FSA's. A parent information letter will be sent home on Monday.
