Indicators of Success:



Area of focus:

Selg Regulation

Self regulation skills and awareness will help me be the best learner I can be and the best community member for others who are working hard to self regulate.

Planned Actions:

Set item for every staff meeting - different staff will highlight one SR strategy along with implementation, scaffolding and instruction strategies that have proven effective with experience. Rest of staff to try elements on own. Highlights/language, stories used on daily announcements when applicable as well as mindful moments on announcements

Assemblies in gym with school - kids teaching kids!
Review and exploration of District Resources on Learning Services Site.

Indicators of Success:

Increase in students using SR strategies independently

Less office referrals for dysregualtion

Increase in time that all students are able to remain in the learning environment Increase in self-advocacy from students for what they need to regulate

Decrease in "shut down" scenarios where students feel "they cannot go on with the assignment, group, day" etc.


Increase in common understanding and language of "regulation" with parents/quardians.

Indigenous Learners and Indigenous Ways of Learning

Area of focus:

First People's Principles of Learning

Learning is embedded in memory, history, and story, involves patience and time and requires exploration of one's identity.

Planned Actions:

Learning some key words and spellings in the traditioanl language of the Kwikwetlem People. Explicity teaching oral storytelling skills so we can all tell "our stories"

Use storywork to learn history of local lands, vegetaion, animals, waters. Invitation, education, celebration and Flag installation with representatives of the Kwikwetlem Nation

Learning how to create meaningful personal land and water acknowledgements

Indicators of Success:

Increase in traditional language usage and awareness
Increase in knowdelge of local stories regarding the land, animals, vegetation
Celebration and pride in personal and family stories
Increase in oral story-telling skills
Meaningful connection to the Kwikwetlem Nation as partners in education

School Community Engagement Process:

Presentation and discussion at PAC meeting

Newsletter information and links to resources for all 3 of our goal areas every month.

Invitaions to special events (flag ceremony) Story telling events. Visible bulletin board displays, signage showing our on-going learning.
