MESSAGE FROM MRS. WALTON

Kindergarten Registration is from Feb 4th - Feb 6th . We are excited to welcome our new families as they register their child(ren) to begin their school journey in September 2025. If you know of any families in the area who have child(ren) turning 5 this year (born in 2020), please encourage them to register. The link for registration is posted at the end of this newsletter. We submit our Kindergarten registration numbers to the district on Friday, February 7th; this preliminary number count is important to our organization. New Kindergarten families should note the following dates: Ready, Set, Learn Event on April 15th and May 7th will be our Welcome to Kindergarten Event.

- Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a RANDOM DRAW PROCESS. (using in-district priority then outof-district)



EARLY DISMISSALS

On Wednesday, February 12th and Thursday, February 13rd students are dismissed at 1:45pm for Early Dismissal Days for Student Led Conferences. A Student-Led Conference is an opportunity for your child to discuss his/her accomplishments. We ask that you support the concept of your child being responsible for managing this task and reporting



to you. Your attendance at this conference will show your support for your child's role in his/her education and children are excited to share with parents. During Student Led Conferences, teachers will not be discussing individual learning needs should you have such concerns, you are encouraged to connect with your child's teacher by email to arrange a suitable time. Term Twp Learning Updates will be issued March 13th.

ATTENDANCE/ LATE STUDENTS/ PICKING STUDENTS UP EARLY

- If your child will be absent/ late for any reason, please send an absence report (link is on our school website under "Quick Links"), phone the office at 604-939-2486 or email Mrs. Tipper at roystibbs@sd43.bc.ca before 9:00 a.m. We have an answering machine to pick up the messages if you call before 8:00 a.m.
- If your child is late please come with them to the office to check in and pick up a Welcome Slip to take to their classroom teacher.
- If you are picking up your child earlier than the regular dismissal time, please phone the office when you arrive, and we will call them down to meet you.
- We need to make sure they have been signed in or out for safety reasons.

ILLNESS / HEALTH ASSESSMENT

Health Self-Assessment – Please continue to review our child's health prior to coming to school. Should they require medication to manage symptoms, they should not come to school. We thank our community for continuing to exercise care for everyone.

HEAD LICE

During these colder months we sometimes see a rise in the number of cases of head lice. Although checking your children's hair should be a regular part of grooming, to help stop the spread of these pests; please check your child carefully for the next couple of months. You will need a bright light to do this. If you find lice and/or nits (lice eggs) on your child's head, treat it as necessary before your child returns to school.

How do I check for lice?

Because lice are tiny, mobile, and hard to spot, it's easier to look for their eggs (nits) rather than the bugs themselves. Live nits can be difficult to spot because they are tan-colored and blend in with the hair. Dead nits are silvery-colored and easier to see. These silvery oval specks are "glued" tightly to individual strands of hair, very close to the scalp. They are very small, about one-third the size of sesame seed. They are mostly found behind their ears and at the back of the neck. Because "nits" can sometimes be mistaken for particles of dandruff, it is sometimes useful to use a magnifying glass when searching. If you do find nits, then lice are sure to be there as well. You can contact the School Public Health Nurse at 604-949-7200 for more information or you can access the Fraser Health Unit website at www.fraserhealth.ca Please remember...ANYONE can get head lice. Their presence is not a sign of poor hygiene, poor housekeeping, or low socioeconomic status. If you find your child has head lice, please notify the school immediately. Thank you for your assistance. We are relying on all parents to participate in checking their children's hair on a regular basis to help prevent the spread of lice.

WINTER WEATHER AHEAD

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall. However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified. The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs before 6:30 a.m. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements. Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Please provide a nutritious snack and lunch that is easy for your child to consume. Please do NOT plan to drop off lunches later in the day – this is an unnecessary complexity when we have over 240 students. Of course, there may be a rare occasion when you must do this due to illness or mix up, but please teach your child to check for their own lunch/water bottle/snack etc. before you leave home! All eating will be done inside

(before play time). There is no sharing food or drink with others. If your child requires any utensils in their lunch, please make sure to pack them in your child's lunchbox.

WEST COAST RECESS/LUNCH

At Roy Stibbs we are committed to providing our students with many opportunities to play outside. Your children will be going outside on many days when it is raining; we call this **West Coast Recess/Lunch**. Please ensure that your child has a good raincoat, proper footwear, a hat, gloves, and umbrellas during the coming fall and winter months. 
