SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR THE 2025-2026

For all incoming Kindergarten students, Kindergarten Supplies will be ordered by the school for families.

- Kindergarten school supplies are ordered by the Kindergarten teachers as shared/communal supplies. Families will be charged a fee of approximately \$30-\$35 which will be collected from each family in September. Since these are communal supplies, please note, there will not be individual supplies sent home.
- Kindergarten parents do not need to purchase any additional supplies for their children.

For Grade 1 through 5 students, families will find supply lists for their child's assigned grade level. School Staff highly recommend purchasing supplies through **School Start** (https://schoolstart.ca/) for the convenience, quality, and overall costs. **Please note the following important details:**

- **Delivery:** School supplies ordered through School Start will be delivered to the school in August and distributed to students in September.
- Ordering: Orders must be placed online; no cash orders will be accepted.
- Deadline: Orders are due by July 31st.
- Late Orders: Any orders placed after July 31st will be delivered to your home with a \$7.50 shipping charge, no exceptions.

As an alternative, Grade 1-5 families are also welcome to use the lists to shop elsewhere. Should families wish to purchase their child's supplies on their own, please note families are responsible for having the supplies to the school, for children's use during the opening week of September.

We understand that some families may be facing extenuating circumstances. If your family is in need of financial assistance with school supplies, please don't hesitate to reach out to bwalton@sd43.bc.ca directly. We are here to support every student's success.

ALL FAMILIES MUST PRINT A COPY FOR THEIR PERSONAL FILES.

Parent Portal Troubleshooting:

- *For best results, use Internet Explorer or Firefox on a desk top computer (not cellular phones).
- *If you mistype your password 3 times, the system will automatically lock your account. After 3 failed attempts click the blue "I forgot my password" link on the log-on screen.
 - The program will ask for your email address as well as the answer to your security question.
 - If you answer it correctly, a new temporary password will be sent to your email account.
 - o If you mistype the answer to your security question 3 times, the "I forgot my password" function will be frozen. In this case, please email school at: roystibbs@sd43.bc.ca
 - Retrieve the temporary password from your email account and use it to log on to the Parent Portal. You will then be asked to create a new password.
- *If you do get locked out, please click on this link to email for re-activation: please email the school at: roystibbs@sd43.bc.ca

GRADUAL ENTRY FOR KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS IN SEPTEMBER

Prior to September, we will be sending out information to families of kindergarten students about the structure of the first two weeks of school. Please be aware that the Ministry of Education has set aside the first two weeks as a period of "gradual entry" for students. This provides us with the time to introduce students to school in the most supportive way possible. During the gradual entry period, teachers will work with our newest learners in small groups to increase the opportunities for the child to interact and to develop an attachment to their new teacher. This also ensures we provide a high level of support as the children are introduced to the routines they will follow at school. At this time, we cannot give you details of days and times for this gradual entry but will be in touch with you prior to September to clarify the schedules.

SCHOOL'S OUT PASS COQUITLAM PARKS & RECREATION

The School's Out Pass is back – and better than ever! Still just \$25 (taxes included), it's now valid from June 20, 2025, to March 29, 2026, and covers every major school break: summer, winter, and spring.

It's available for children **0 – 18** years old for unlimited access to Coquitlam's drop-in activities, including:

- <u>Indoor</u> and <u>outdoor</u> pools;
- <u>Drop-in sports</u>, including basketball, badminton and volleyball;
- <u>Drop-in skating</u>; and
- <u>Fitness centre and drop-in fitness classes</u> (available only to youth 13 18 years old). Teens 13 15 years old must complete a <u>fitness orientation</u> before participating in the fitness centres and drop-in fitness classes.

ATTENDANCE/ LATE STUDENTS/ PICKING STUDENTS UP EARLY

- If your child will be absent/ late for any reason, please send an absence report (link is on our school website under "Quick Links"), phone the office at 604-939-2486 or email Mrs. Tipper at roystibbs@sd43.bc.ca before 9:00 a.m. We have an answering machine to pick up the messages if you call before 8:00 a.m.
- If your child is late please come with them to the office to check in and pick up a Welcome Slip to take to their classroom teacher.
- If you are picking up your child earlier than the regular dismissal time, please phone the office when you arrive, and we will call them down to meet you.
- We need to make sure they have been signed in or out for safety reasons.

SNACKS AND LUNCHES

Please provide a nutritious snack and lunch that is easy for your child to consume. Please do NOT plan to drop off lunches later in the day – this is an unnecessary complexity when we have over 240 students. Of course, there may be a rare occasion when you must do this due to illness or mix up, but please teach your child to check for their own lunch/water bottle/snack etc. before you leave home! All eating will be done inside (before play time). There is no sharing food or drink with others. If your child requires any utensils in their lunch, please make sure to pack them in your child's lunchbox.
