- 2.Approval of Agenda for Monday September 26, 2022 Agnes Mayer –> all in favor
- 3.Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting (Monday May 9th, 2022) Agnes Mayer -> all in favor
- 4.Administrator's Report Lisa Rinke/Leanne Kemp
- -Scott Creek hosted a very successful parent night incredible to see such a great turnout
- -currently the Scott Creek community has 650 students & 25 classes
- -Sports have started with volleyball and swimming
- -Intramurals begin next week giant volleyball at lunch in the gym
- -Gr. 7's will be completing FSA's in October reading, writing, numeracy test online and on paper-parent can reach out to classroom teacher for more information
- -Scott Creek had a 'Shelter in Place' today where students stayed in their class/building. Typically, this would happen if there was a bear on the grounds, cougar sited near creek, etc.; this is different from hold and secure when there is police involvement
- -BC ministry has announced a Student and Family affordability fund monies go to school supplies, field trips, and support; this will start in the first week of October ministry uses a vulnerability index to determine how much money is available to each school; Lisa is asking for PAC input into how the funds should be allocated

5. President's Report - Melissa Fisher

- -there is a need to get some money into our general account to support initiatives such as the grade 8 leaving celebration, staff appreciation lunch, special guests, etc.
- -Melissa is hopeful to run a Purdy's chocolate fundraising campaign during this holiday season; Nov 14 is the proposed launch day, with a closing date Nov. 28; all payments will be made on-line with a shared link
- -all chocolate orders will be ready for Mon Dec. 12

- -the Executive is thinking about a hybrid online/in-person model for PAC meetings this school year
- -Nov. 21 is the next scheduled meeting- in-person at Scott Creek (7 p.m. in the school library)
