Again, welcome back! It's a pleasure to report that we are fully organized and, with our 2015-2016 school year underway, students are settling comfortably into classrooms and roots are taking shape to support teaching and learning in the months ahead. The school year promises to be a rich one and I'd like to take an opportunity in this early edition of our weekly school newsletter to highlight some of the big ideas taking shape both in all BC schools and specifically here at Seaview Community School. Curriculum Change K-9 in BC Schools

The Ministry of Education has been engaged in the process of updating our K-9 curriculum over the past two school years. Consulting with teachers, parents and students, the Ministry has undergone a redesign which is transitioning at K-9 this school year and being fully implemented in September 2016. The new curriculum introduces a focus on *Core Competencies* in three domains: Communication, Thinking and Personal & Social, numeracy and literacy foundations and essential content and concepts. Social-Emotional Learning

Currently in our school district, over 75% of our schools K-12 have formal school goals in the area of social-emotional learning. At Seaview, we are in our fifth year of a concentration on developing **self-regulation skills** in our students in order that they be aware of their strengths and what they need to be ready to learn both at school and in their wider lived experience. This year, we are working on developing skills in the emotional domain of self-regulation and look forward to partnering with home to grow these skills and competencies in our children. This coming Friday on ProD Day all Seaview staff is participating in an inservice called *Play is the Way* here at the school. Below are the objectives of the workshop:

- To help create a safe learning environment in which students learn to be independent, self-regulating, self-motivated learners in pursuit of their personal best and ability to get along with one another
- To help develop students of strong character and decency with the social and emotional competencies to live and learn well
- To foster empathetic students, considerate of themselves, each other and the world in which they live with sound and good reasons for the things they say and do

Communicating Student Learning

At Seaview over the past two years we have undertaken a pilot project in communicating student learning. Many of you have been involved in and now have first-had experience with our efforts to improve and maximize the value of formal reporting to parents. We have worked with 3-Way conferences, changes to report card templates, formal feedback on core competencies and social-emotional learning and assessment that concentrates on personalized feedback and less attention to letter grades. Changes to communicating student learning/reporting are a focus of the BC Ministry of Education and a natural extension of what's to come with the new curriculum. At Seaview we have worked hard to be part of the change and are now able to contribute meaningfully at the district level to conversations about reporting and communicating student progress at the K-5 level. Stay tuned for more opportunity for parents to learn about this process at Seaview.

Finally, I wish to extend a sincere thank you to everyone for your positive support as we organized over the past two weeks. It was fabulous to see so any parents come out (almost 100% attendance) to our Grades 1-5 Welcoming Conversations, a testament to the strength of our community partnership here at Seaview. We're all tied together.

E Forms Information

At the beginning of each school year, there are number of necessary forms that we need you to complete. **These forms will be available online shortly, please keep checking the website and newsletters.** It is crucial that you complete the required forms for each student. They will be available online in our Seaview Community Portal <u>www.sd43.bc.ca/elementary/Seaview</u>

- 1. School Policies
- 2. Emergency Release

Additionally, you will find on that page the following optional forms:

- **Medical Alert** To be completed at the start of each school year but only if your child has a medical concern.
- **Volunteer Application** To be completed once at each school level by parents and non-parents who are planning to volunteer at our school. Note: you also need to drop off a criminal record check (CRC) at the school office. Contact the school to ensure your CRC is still valid.
- Driver Application To be completed at the start of each school year by volunteers who are planning to transport students during school field trips. Note: you will also need to drop off a driver's abstract and a criminal record check at the school office and complete a Volunteer Application form (once per school level).
- Absence Report (available currently) To be completed when your child is going to be away from school

An Important Note about Medical Alerts

Information about medical alerts is completed on eForms at the beginning of each school year. However, if your child has a life-threatening medical condition, please make contact with her/his teacher and the school office prior to the completing of your official eForm. This will ensure that we have the necessary information and can take you through our process in a timely way and ensure your child's safety at school.

Parking Lot Safety

As a community we are collectively concerned at all times with the safety and well-being of our children. **To that end, please regard carefully the signage in our parking lot and comply with the instructions**. Whenever possible, avoid driving in our parking lot. You can use street parking and walk on, walk or ride from home, carpool or avoid the busier times. Thank in you in advance for your support and courtesy toward others in our parking lot. **Please do not leave your car unattended in no parking areas.** This is very problematic and a safety issue for emergency vehicles and access.

Chapters-Indigo Adopt-A-School Update

It seems like just yesterday our community rallied to participate in Chapters-Indigo Adopt-A-School contest. We came out in droves to vote for Seaview and it was a wonderful time for our school. A refresher and up-to speed for new families: we placed second place and won over \$12,000 in free books and materials for our library and classrooms!

Over the course of last school year we were able to order new materials for every classroom, collect student's wish lists and order their choices for the library. We gathered input from teachers on curricular resources for our library and professional reading for everyone. Morning Supervision at Seaview

Morning supervision is provided by Seaview staff from 8:45 a.m. until our warning bell rings at 8:55 a.m., with classes starting at 9:00 a.m. Children who are at school without parents need to be outside on the playground and in undercover areas at the back of the school not before 8:45 a.m. Safe supervision is a priority for us and we are unable to provide supervision before 8:30 a.m. Children are in the care of parents, guardians or a daycare facility before this time. If you wish to read with your child in our school library in the morning you are very welcome and we invite you to be in the library with your child until the warning bell rings; children cannot be left unsupervised in the school library. Thank you for regarding the supervision guidelines at our school and for supporting us to keep children safe.

Enjoying Outside Play at Seaview: Rain or Shine

Placing emphasis on active living and outdoor exploration, we experience very few inside play days at Seaview. It is our practice to play outside at recess and lunch, rain or shine. Families are encouraged to ensure children are dressed appropriately for the weather conditions and to assume that, unless weather conditions are unsafe and extreme, children will play outside. Our focus on outdoor learning and exploration at Seaview continues to play an important role in our classrooms and community and ensuring children ample opportunity to be outside is central to our success.

Cell Phones, Electronics and Toys

Please be advised that cell phones and other electronic devices as well as toys should be left at home during the school day. There is always the real possibility of a device being lost or broken either in the classroom or the playground. If you feel your child must bring a cell phone to school, Mrs. Kristjanson will store it in the office for the day and your child may pick the item up at 3 pm. Thank you for your support.

Absent or Late Students

If your child will be absent or late, please call the office at 604 936-9991 or click on the Absence report on our website. If your child comes to school late, please have them sign in at the office prior to attending their class.

Parents are reminded of the importance of arriving at school on time. Punctual arrivals set up good days for students.

Visits to the School

During the school day if you have a need to contact your child, please stop by or call the office so we can help. Visitors to the school who are here to volunteer need to sign in at the office and wear a visitor's pass. This practice is to assist children in knowing how to spot safe adults in our building and also protects the safety and privacy of our students during school time. Thank you in advance for helping us maintain a safe and orderly environment.
