SCHOOL NEWS

Emergency Preparedness and Student Release: Wednesday, May 4th, 1:30pm

For school communities, taking care of student safety is a fundamental concern and responsibility. While we engage in ongoing safety drills and education at our school site, we less frequently undergo school-wide safety procedures that involve our whole community. Emergency Preparedness Week is May 2nd through 6th and School District #43 is conducting a district-wide gradual student release procedure at all school sites over the course of this week. It is important for us to revisit and practice our gradual release procedures to ensure they are soundly in place to protect the well-being of our students in the event of a major earthquake or natural disaster.

Seaview's **Gradual Student Release Day** will take place on Wednesday, May 4th at 1:30pm. **Parents or their designate will need to come to the school and pick up their children.** Our release procedure will take place from our back field and children will only be released to parents or designates who produce identification to school staff. We will be practicing a procedure identical to what is in place in the event of a true episode. **Please be aware that our front parking lot will be blocked off as this area, in the event of a disaster, would be reserved for emergency vehicles. You will need to park on the street and walk onto site or walk to the school from home.** It is important that our drill is authentic.

Please consider the following:

- 1. **Is our family's Emergency Release Form on file at the school?** This is critical as it identifies which parties your child can be safely released to and provides us with up to date contact information.
- 2. **Is my child's Medical Alert information and supplies provided to the school?** In the event of a true disaster your child could be in our care for a more extended period of time. This information is important.
- 3. Does my alternate emergency contact understand their responsibility to collect my child in the event I'm unable to? Please review this with your emergency contact and ensure they are aware of the school's procedure. The school will release your child only to you or this party.

In the past a full gradual release of students has taken the better part of an hour and a half. The timing of this drill should ensure we have time to practice an orderly and safe release of all children.

Thank you, Seaview, for supporting this important exercise. While we hope we need never implement this process, practicing will go a long way to solidifying our collective confidence in responding to protect student safety in the event we need to.


