Tuesday, March 7th - Natasha Deen

Writing is STORY, and stories change the world. Natasha's family immigrated from Guyana to Canada to escape the country's political and racial violence, which was great. But, when she was growing up in Calgary, she was often the only coloured kid in class and usually the only mixed race kid, too (Chinese, African,



West-Indian, East Indian), which led to funny moments and moments she wishes she could forget. For sure, she grew up feeling different fromwell, everyone. Thank goodness for books and comic books, because boy, were those things **full** of weird, oddball, don't-quite-fit-in characters who actually turned out to be amazing and cool.

Natasha went to university and got a degree in Psychology **but** wouldn't you know it, while she was there, she found out something amazing. Actually, she found out that stories change brain chemistry and **writing can boost your immune system and help speed up the body's healing process.** And oh yeah, when you read, it's like this crazy, amazing, awesome literary magic trick between you and the writer.

Natasha writes for kids and teens, and loves mixing mystery, action, and creepy with a whole lot of humour. Her books have been described as "gripping" (School Library Connection), "engaging" (CM Magazine and "feel good" (VOYA).

ACTION PLAN for LEARNING (APL) February Update

In December, we focused on Connecting with the Community. We requested collecting items for Christmas hampers in the form of wrapped shoe or mandarin orange boxes. Each class received a list of suitable items for the boxes, which were delivered to people in need, at a community outreach facility that our PAC helps to support.

We are so excited to announce that our school goal was to get 24 female boxes and 48 male boxes and your generosity allowed us to far exceed this goal. We were able to make 57 female boxes and 70 male boxes. We also had a bunch of extra toiletries that were passed on to the outreach facility to use on a regular basis.

Throughout the month of January we focused on Volunteer Opportunities available within our community. We have a board with lots of ideas and contact information near the front of the school. This board will be up for most of the year, as we will also be show casing some of our students who volunteer. Teachers will be doing a write-up on the students in their class who volunteer. We also had an amazing opportunity during our January Professional Development day to discuss how the core competencies are so integrated into our curriculum and tie in nicely to our school goal. We re-looked at how students are making connections with their peers and staff members.

For the month of February we will be focusing on kindness for others. Students will have the opportunity to anonymously recognize others within our school for helping them out.
