During that meeting, Mr. Bozic and I will present some general information and the rationale for the proposed change in communicating student learning. We will also be scheduling a parent evening later in the term during which time some of our teachers and students will be presenting a more in-depth session.

This upcoming school year we are anticipating an increase in enrolment. It will be virtually impossible to make class changes if we hear from you after May 18th. We appreciate your consideration, support and understanding.

If you are planning to <u>move away</u> from Summit's school catchment area prior to September or go on an <u>extended vacation</u> that goes past our school start date, would you please inform the office at your earliest convenience. Rugby Season is beginning!!!

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Rugby is being offered to Summit Middle students this Spring. Rugby is a contact sport that develops teamwork, strength, fitness, honor and fair play. Sign-up sheets are available already. Come give it a try.

Historically, Senior Boys have played games on Thursdays, the Girls on Tuesdays and Boys 6/7 Tournaments have been on Fridays. Students need cleats and a mouth guard to play. Tournaments are normally played at Scott Creek Middle School. An invitation tournament is also planned at Eagle Mountain Middle at the end of the season.

Middle schools in Coquitlam have played Boys and Girls Union Rugby. Grade 6/7 Boys teams have also played 7-aside rugby. Some years, there have been an invitational 7-aside tournament.

To offer the best rugby program to Summit Middle students, we will hold practices at Eagle Mountain Middle School. We will have a strong coaching staff, including coaches from different middle schools as well as community coaches. Practices are planned for Wednesdays, as well as Tuesdays when players do not have tournaments. A calendar schedule will be shared once the district games are confirmed.

Students will need to organize their own transport to and from Eagle Mountain Middle school for practices. They will also need to be transported to tourneys. The school will not be organizing transport to and from rugby. Thank you in advance for your time and effort.

Summit Rugby Team Practices will begin Tuesday, April 10th. All teams have practices April 10, 11, 17 and 18. The following week, our introductory tourneys take place. We are always pleased if parents have rugby skills they can share with our players.
