Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Guardians;

This month we will be hosting "three-way conferences" on Tuesday February 20th and Wednesday February 21st from 1:00 – 7:00pm. Please note the early dismissal time of 1:00pm!

Three-way conferences provide an opportunity for the student, his/her parents and the teacher to engage in dialogue around the student's learning. All three parties have a role to play. Because only one conference can take place at a time in each class, and the conferences will last approximately 15 minutes each, we will be dismissing classes early and teachers will be staying late both days to accommodate families.

Your child's teacher will be in contact with you to set up your conference. Please note that the conference is considered one of our five mandatory "reports" to parents, and therefore it is required that all students/families take part, and, documentation of the conference will be placed in the student's school file along with other report cards. Of course, teachers will work with individual families to work around special circumstances, allowing for the conference to take place at an alternative time, if necessary. It was a pleasure to see so many families join us last week for our Coffee and Conversation session. The session focused on student voice/student ownership of their learning and the students' role in assessment and reporting. Ms. Dziwak, Mr. Raghoobarsingh and students provided us with insights as to work that has been done in classes which reflects student voice and ownership of their learning.

We are looking forward to seeing families in our school for the "three-way conferences" in a couple of weeks!

Vice-Principal's Message

Dear parents and guardians,

With over 750 students and staff, Summit Middle plays a big part in what goes on in our neighbourhood and how we interact with one another. This also means that each of us has a big part in being responsible, well behaved and caring for not only our school community but our neighbouring homes and businesses as well. In sharing the space that we work, play, and live in, we're asking our school community to be mindful of personal behaviours in the private and public space surrounding Summit Middle, especially during the drop-off and pick-up times of the day.

Our expectation is that students behave appropriately and respectfully, not only while at school but out and about in the community as well. As such, we have recently reminded students to not trespass through any private property by going in and walking along side the fence line of the condominium complexes (our neighbours) as a means for a short cut. While we understand and appreciate the difficulty parents may have in finding a spot to park their vehicle to wait for their child(ren) after school, parents are not to be parking in our neighbours' private stalls or roadways, immediately before or after the crosswalk, or in the bus stop area. As a resident of the complexes surrounding Summit Middle, I imagine, it can be very frustrating to have to deal with not only the traffic congestion on Parkway Boulevard but the disregard by others of private property. After all, you wouldn't want to arrive home only to find that someone has parked in your driveway or stall without permission, leaving you to find parking far away from home.

We, as I'm sure parents do as well, also expect our students to behave appropriately in and around the businesses of the Westwood Plateau Village and Petro-Canada gas station. While the Westwood Plateau Village and Petro-Canada parking lots are convenient for picking-up students, use of the parking areas for this purpose does affect businesses and customers of those establishments. At the end of the day, the stores and customers other than students often deal with inappropriate student behaviours (such as being overly loud and boisterous, blocking entrances or pathways, using vulgar language, or simply fooling around in an unsafe manner). The frustrations some stores feel is compounded by the added inconvenience and/or loss of customers for the businesses due to parking spaces being occupied by waiting parents for lengthy periods of time.

We need your help – parents and students – to make things better in our neighbourhood. Summit Middle School is often first to be contacted by neighbours addressing student and driver concerns, and though we take each concern seriously and act upon them quickly, our scope is limited. Working together, we can make things better. After all, this community is our home.

Please have a conversation with your child; perhaps they could provide more insight as well.




