A band program is offered to students at Summit Middle. The courses are graded and rehearsals take place two mornings per week (7:45 to 8:30 a.m.), prior to the beginning of regular classes.

In early September, interested students and their parents will have the opportunity to select instruments and rental information will be provided at that time.

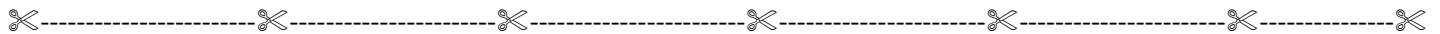
We are looking forward to welcoming your son or daughter to Summit Middle School!
