Jump Rope for Heart


We will be hosting our Kick-off assembly for 'Jump Rope for Heart' on <u>Friday</u>, <u>January 16th</u>, 2015.

Thank you for supporting the tennis program. Each child is receiving 5 lessons with a Tennis Canada certified instructor. The kids love it and the instructor tells me daily how nice it is to work with our children.

Parent/Teacher Interviews & Early Dismissal

At the start of the year we originally had two early dismissal days schedule so that each teacher could have an interview with each family in their class. We missed those days due to job action. We felt like we could not give you enough notice to plan an early dismissal in this first term.

We have moved the early dismissal days to March 3, 2015 Parent/Teacher Interviews, where parents can request an interview with the teacher. Report cards will go home March 4, 2015.

April 16, 2015 will be an early dismissal for student led conferences. On early dismissal days the day ends at 1:45.

Organic Waste Recycling

Blakeburn will be recycling organic waste. That means that we will have compost bins in each class that get emptied into a main bin each day. The new recycling bins will be stored near the entrance to the gym. To prepare for this shift we ask that each family tries to create litter-less lunches. As well we will encourage children to take home uneaten food and juice boxes that are empty.

We will add these items:

- Meat, poultry, fish, shellfish and bones
- Egg and dairy products
- Table scraps and plate scrapings
- Vegetables, salad and fruit
- Bread, dough, pasta, grains
- Coffee grounds, filters and tea bags
- Paper towels, napkins and plates
- Pizza delivery boxes

We will not add these items:

- Plastic bags or compostable plastics
- Coffee cups
- Containers
- Glass, metal, plastic, or foil
- Plastic wrap or plastic take-out containers
- Paper cartons or take-out containers
- Cork or Styrofoam
- Wire, twist ties or rubber bands
- Latex
- Grease or liquids
- Produce baskets, netting

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION NOTICE

Kindergarten registration for September 2015 will be held throughout the district on February 3, 4, 5, 2015.

Parents should register their children at the elementary school serving their neighborhood/ catchment. Please bring the following documents:

Proof of citizenship for parent & child (one of): birth certificate; passport; PR Card; Canadian Citizenship Card.

Proof of BC residency for parent (one of): rental contract; property purchase contract; income tax statement; property tax statement; and 2 of the following documents: utility bill; BC driver's license; BC vehicle registration; Canadian bank or credit card statement; BC ID.

Only those students who are five years of age on or before December 31, 2015 can be accepted for September 2015.
