- Literacy 10 <u>All Grade 10's</u> will write the Literacy 10 Assessment. We will automatically register you; no action needed on your part.
- Numeracy 10 Grade 10's <u>taking Math 10 this semester</u> will <u>automatically be registered</u> to write the Numeracy 10 Assessment; no action required on your part.
- Numeracy 10 (make-up, re-writes) For a variety of reasons, there may be students who missed or wish to re-write the Numeracy 10 Assessment. Please come to the main office or email <u>kthibault@sd43.bc.ca</u> to request that you be registered. Remember this is a graduation requirement so if you haven't done it, this is essential!
