UNIVERSITY OF VICTORIA - APPLICATION DEADLINES EXTENDED

UVic is still accepting undergraduate applications for September 2024 for most programs. Students should check [EducationPlannerBC](#) to see if their program is still open. They are encouraged to apply as soon as possible as applications can close without notice. Applicants with an admission average above 90% will be eligible to receive a UVic Entrance Scholarship valued between \$2,000 and \$4,000. International applicants applying from high schools in Canada with an admission average of 85% or higher are eligible for a University of Victoria International Entrance Scholarship valued at \$10,000.
