## AN EXCEPTIONAL VISIT TO COQUITLAM SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR TWO KENYAN STUDENTS COMES TO A

## <u>CLOSE</u>

On Oct 28, two Kenyan students Allan Waithira and Denis Chege, arrived in the Coquitlam School District for a two month stay. They were selected due to their hard work in a course called Butterfly Effect; an independent study course where students at Dr. Charles Best Secondary School in Coquitlam, along with students in Langley, Surrey and Kenya do projects of their own personal interest and support each other in an online community of learners (<u>Butterflyeffect.hoop.la</u>).

Butterfly Effect is a cultural exchange component of PA-MOJA (<u>PA-MOJA.com</u>), which is a small grassroots NGO that partners schools in North America with schools in Kenya for authentic connections and to preserve wildlife. Coquitlam has a number of PA-MOJA schools so during their stay, Allan and Denis spent one day a week at Maple Creek Middle, Kilmer Elementary and Mary Hill Elementary to share their culture and learn Canadian culture. This deep connection has allowed all the schools involved to expose students to the new core and curricular competencies of the new BC curriculum in an authentic way.



Denis and Allan stayed with homestay families from the district and got to experience many Canadian activities. The visit has profoundly impacted both the two Kenyan students and also the many students at Coquitlam schools. Everyone involved would like to thank the Coquitlam School District for providing the flights for the students and to all the schools, students, parents and homestay families who made the visit such a success. We also want to thank everyone who donated clothes and tickets for activities; it really helped the boys fit in to our schools, acclimatize to our weather and have some great experiences.

Denis and Allan will return to Kenya on Dec 28<sup>th</sup>. They will bring back the knowledge and experiences from Coquitlam to the Kenyan schools involved in the project. ### **ONE MATCH PROJECT**

On Wednesday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, Social Justice 12 students worked with Canadian Blood Services in the One Match project. What is One Match? It is a campaign to register 17 to 35 year olds into a DNA database which can be used to match stem cells to cure blood cancers and diseases. The students encouraged their fellow grade 12's to be informed and be cheek-swabbed to collect a DNA sample. In only three blocks of time, there were 102 grade 12 students registered and gave the opportunity to save lives. Dr. Charles Best is the only school in Coquitlam to partner with Canadian Blood Services in this way. We are very proud of all the participants in this very important event.

#### **MR. JONES' WOODWORKING CLASS**

Grade 12 students Dino Bakas and Jacob Williams from Mr. Jones' woodworking class, work on the new benches that will be installed throughout the halls. As part of a school-wide initiative, students are helping with projects that will revitalize Dr. Charles Best Secondary. The benches are made of maple plywood and solid maple molding and will be cantilevered from the walls.



#### **ATHLETIC LEADERSHIP CLASS**

On Wednesday Dec 7<sup>th</sup>, the Athletic Leadership class hosted 180 grade 5 students from around the district for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Volleyball Jamboree. In partnership with Mr. Passaglia (Principal of Porter Elementary) the leadership students ran the volleyball tournament and concession. The athletic leadership students donated the proceeds of \$425 from the concession to the food bank. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> district volleyball tournament the class has run for middle school and elementary schools this term. Students have been complimented for their leadership skills. The students also volunteer once a week at Ranch Park Elementary where they conduct PE lessons for students. Well done!
