BCGUE 2017 SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships for full-time studies are \$3,000 and \$2,000.for part-time studies.

Applicants must be:

A BCGEU member; or related to a current, retired or deceased BCGEU member or staff. A student or prospective post-secondary or higher learning student enrolled, registered or planning to attend an eligible educational institution in 2017. Eligible relatives include spouses,(same or opposite sex and common law spouses); parents; and children and grandchildren (including foster, adopted and step children and grandchildren).
