MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As our first semester winds to a close, it is hard to believe that we are already half way through another school year. Best has been a busy place with our students, and teachers, wrapping up semester one classes, and finalizing marks. Look for the report cards to come home on Friday, February 3rd.

This past week, our grade 9's enjoyed a fabulous presentation from our own Mr. Dy as part of their Career Education 9 requirements, and many of our grade 12's wrote provincial exams and completed Exit Interviews as part of their Grad Transitions requirements.

We will have a few staffing changes coming up. Firstly, we wish Mrs. O'Neill all the very best as she returns to enjoy retired life after serving as our vice-principal for the entire first semester. Mrs. O'Neill graciously agreed to return to help us out when Mrs. Young was seconded to a district position. I cannot thank Mrs. O'Neill enough for her generosity, care, compassion and expertise. We also say good-bye and thank you to Ms. Croft who completes her first semester only position teaching Ceramics and Social Studies. Best of luck in your next teaching position.

We are fortunate to have Vice Principal Mrs. Buteau joining us on February 1st. Mrs. Buteau has been an administrator within the Vancouver School District for a number of years and we welcome her experience and expertise at Best. We also welcome Ms. Bablitz as a full time teacher in our Learning Resource Centre for the remainder of the school year. The staffing for this position resulted from an agreement reached between the Province, BCPSEA, and the BCTF to provide school districts with \$50 million to immediately begin hiring teachers and improve student supports. The interim measures, outlined in a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), are the first step in responding to the decision from the Supreme Court of Canada as negotiations continue on the restored collective agreement provisions.

Even as the first semester is ending, we are already actively planning for the next school year. Our counsellors have completed articulation meetings with our feeder middle schools and in mid-February, they will begin course programming for the 2017-2018 school year. It is important that students and parents understand that the courses students choose on their programming sheets directly determine the courses that will be offered next year. Please get involved in your child's course planning, and plan to attend the Grade 9–11 Parent Information Night scheduled for Thursday, February 23rd at 7 pm. If you have any questions, please contact your child's counsellor.

Now that our first semester is over, we look forward to settling in for part two of our school year. Students have already received their semester two schedules and classes will begin first thing on Tuesday morning.


FINE ARTS
