INTERIM REPORTS PARENT/TEACHER/STUDENT INTERVIEWS – MARCH 2017

The Interim Reporting process will be the same as it was in October. We remain committed to communicating student progress with families and will specifically focus on students who are struggling at this time. Teachers will email directly the parents/guardians of any students who are either "Not Meeting Expectations" or "Minimally Meeting Expectations" in their classes. If you do not receive any emails from teachers by 5:00 pm on March 2nd (the date when our original interims were scheduled to be brought home), the assumption is that your child is "Meeting Expectations" in all of his/her classes. While this process may not feel like it is providing sufficient information, it is actually similar to the "snapshot" of student progress that interims typically communicate at this time. The third formal report card, with letter grades, work habits, and teacher comments, will be distributed to all students on April 27th, as per our usual formal reporting timeline. As always, you are encouraged to contact teachers directly, either by email or phone, for more information regarding your child's progress. You are also invited to attend the Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews that are scheduled for Thursday, March 9th from 3:00 to 5:00 pm and 5:48 to 7:48 pm.
