Be very vigilant as drivers are often distracted as they are moving in and out of waiting spots. ### **\*\*\*VAPORIZERS – AN ADDITION TO THE CODE OF CONDUCT\*\*\***

#### **VAPING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE SCHOOL OR ON SCHOOL GROUNDS**

We have noted an increase in the use of these devices by our student population at Charles Best. While there are documented health concerns associated with vaping, these devices have also become a safety issue. We are using this opportunity to inform students and parents **that vaporizers and/or e-cigarettes cannot be possessed at school under any circumstances**. There have been recent incidents in our school/district that have resulted in these devices unintentionally exploding which can result in serious injury for the user and those around them. For the safety of all of our students and staff, it is important that these devices are not on school property. Students are not permitted to have these devices in their lockers, backpacks, or on their person at any time while on school property. If a student is found in possession of a vaporizer or e-cigarette, it will be confiscated. Parents will be contacted and required to meet with the administration and their son/daughter. Reoccurring incidents will result in disciplinary action.

## **JANUARY PROVINCIAL EXAMS**

Please review this announcement carefully for important information regarding the upcoming Provincial Exams, January 23 – 26).

### **-Numeracy Exam**

All students enrolled in **Math 10** Semester 1, will be writing the Numeracy Exam on **Tuesday, January 23**. All students enrolled in **Math 11** Semester 1, will be writing the Numeracy Exam on **Wednesday, January 24**. Please look for your name, exam time (morning or afternoon), and room allocation posted in the front foyer and the library **PRIOR** to exam week.

All students must write in their designated time slot, so make sure you know when you are writing. If you are registered in Math 10 or Math 11 and your name is not on the list, please see Mrs. Young or Mrs. McKay as soon as possible.

### **-ENGLISH 12, Communications 12, and French Immersion 12**

All students writing **English 12, Thursday, January 25 at 8:30 am**, should check their room allocation posted in the front foyer and the library **PRIOR** to exam week.

**Communications 12** students will be writing **Friday, January 26 at 8:30 am**. Students writing **FRAL 12** will also write on **Friday, Jan 26 at 12:30 pm**.

Please check the posted lists to confirm your room allocation. If your name is not on the list, please see Mrs. Young or Mrs. McKay as soon as possible.

It is extremely important that you know the date and time of your exam(s) and the room you are allocated too. All students are asked to arrive **30 minutes** before the exam starts to allow for registration and computer log in.
