MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I hope you are all enjoying the incredibly warm weather we have been having, especially after such a cold March! While it is hard to believe we are already in the home stretch of the school year, it actually feels much more like July than April.

Our mid-semester report cards were sent home yesterday (Thursday, April 26). Please take time to review this report with your son or daughter and help them to reflect on what contributes to their successful learning. It is important that, as the warm weather arrives, students are attending classes and are committed to focusing on their work. This is especially vital for our Grade 12 students who, quite naturally, are looking forward to the graduation celebrations, but who also must keep their focus firmly on classroom achievement. Remember, only students who are **passing all courses** required for graduation will be permitted to participate in the Commencement Ceremonies on Saturday, June 9.

For those students who are struggling in some courses, it is important to access the supports that are available. Additionally, we encourage students who are taking the Math 10 Foundations and Pre-Calculus course to access the tutorial resources on the School District's website at: <u>SD43 Math Resource Centre</u>.

Earlier this week, we sent out a Grad Handout for parents that outlined key information pertaining to graduation – this information was also presented to the graduating class at last week's Grad Assembly. Please note that there are **3 important deadlines for Monday, April 30** – completion of Grad Transitions (including the Exit Interview), submission of a <u>Grad Commencement Message</u> (click the link), and submission of the *Grad Guest Application Form* for those students interested in inviting a guest to Dinner/Dance. These deadlines are firm, so please check-in with your grad to see what may need to be completed over the weekend in order for students to meet these deadlines.

GOLF

On a stormy Friday at Guilford Golf Course, the battle for the blue jacket commenced at the Charles Best Master Championship. As the match progressed, two golfers pulled away from the pack. They are also a little short of players and this has meant a couple of default losses. With only 16 players on our team (there are 15 needed to field a team), we have set our goal of playing 500 rugby this season. It has been an exciting year for rugby at Best! With our 2 senior teams playing excellent rugby and a tour to kick things off, there has definitely been a rugby buzz in the school! The Boys and Girls' teams played various club teams in Trinidad and our boys also played the U19 Trinidad National Team. In Tobago, we had the opportunity to play a Club Men's team (we managed a tie!) and a Club Women's team. The tour wasn't just rugby – the teams also had a chance to see the sites and enjoy Caribbean cuisine. It was an excellent trip creating lifelong friendships and memories and the players are already asking when the next one will be. Although there is nothing in the works yet, it would seem reasonable to expect that our next trip will happen soon enough in a few years.

TRACK AND FIELD

Charles Best's track & field team opened its season on April 11 at the Coquitlam Classic, with Percy Perry stadium playing host. The athletes were met with utterly miserable conditions, as the rain pounded down and the wind buffeted runners, throwers, and jumpers alike. T'was a rough day! Despite the horrid weather, our athletes competed gamely; Georgia Hamnet won both the Junior Girls' javelin and shot put competitions, Charlotte Moon placed second in the Junior Girls' long jump, and Amara Duncan, Georgia Hamnet, Carly Seemann, and Julia Neufeld combined to finish third in the Senior Girls' 4x100. Our second meet of the season – the Nick Wilkes Invitational at Maple Ridge Secondary – saw a significant improvement in the weather, as warm, sunny skies greeted the athletes on April 24. Carly Seemann dominated the Junior Girls' 300m hurdles, then quickly doubled-back and finished second in the Senior Girls' high jump. 
