CROSS CATCHMENT PROCESS

Application forms can be accessed online at www.sd43.bc.ca between Thursday, February 6, 2020, 9 am to Wednesday, February 12, 2020, 4 pm. Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a random draw process (using in-district priority, then out of district). If enrolment projections show that space is available, cross catchment transfer applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities: (i) catchment area child; (ii) non-catchment area child; and (iii) non-school district child.



Dear Parents and Guardians;

The last day of scheduled classes for Semester 1 is **Friday January 17**th, **2020.** While there are no regular classes scheduled for the week of January 20-24th, many members of our school community will still be expected to attend, especially students who are taking a provincial assessment and students who have an Incomplete (I) grade, incomplete assignments and projects. This is the time students can meet with teachers and make up missed work.

For those students who have an I or need additional support to complete their class successfully:

- Teachers will communicate with you and your child if they have an "I" (Incomplete). Teachers will be available to help students complete their work, accept projects, and complete assessments.
- Students will be expected to attend until they have successfully resolved their "I" (Incomplete).

We also have **scheduled assemblies on Monday and Tuesday for Grade 9 students. All Grade 9s are expected to attend.** Monday's presentation topic is Career Education and Tuesday's presentation will be by Jesse Miller, for their COL Digital Learning 10 course. Both days students will be at Best from 10 am – 12 noon and there will be an assignment that will need to be completed and then submitted during the next advisory in February.

Literacy and numeracy assessments will occur throughout the week. Grade 10 students will be writing both the Literacy and Numeracy assessment and Grade 11 and 12 students who have not written the Numeracy assessment will also be writing. These students should check the lists posted outside of the office for the date, time, and room location of their assessment. *These assessments are graduation requirements*. It is important that all students show up for their scheduled time to complete the assessment.

Grade 12 students should be working on their Capstone projects and/or discussing their projects with their mentors. All grade 12's will be presenting their Capstone on April 15, 2020. Early graduates will be presenting on Monday, January 20, 2020.
