Dear Parents/Guardians,


May is here and that means that the school year is edging even closer to the finish line. Amazing to think of all that has been accomplished in 2023/2024 and all that is yet to come.

KATESLEM AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Kateslem after school program runs 5 days per week after school until 5:30 pm. This is a free program but requires a commitment to attend of 4 days per week, staying the full day. Our program is not a daycare and has been running out of Como Lake for over 15 years. It is a youth program geared towards learning essential life skills, trying different activities, cooking, baking, gardening, homework help, and much more. There are also field trips when funding is available. There is limited space as we only have room for 20 youth at this location with snacks provided. STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2023/2024

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in 2024, the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 7, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

The e-survey site will be open <u>until May 3rd.</u>


Login TO MYED BC Portal

Access to the portal can be found <u>HERE</u>. It is best practice to go to our school website and click on "MyEdBC Family Portal" under "quick Links. Avoid using google to search for MyEd BC because it often takes you to a different link and it won't work properly!

Your MyEd BC Login is 43-youremailaddress. Please note that every three months, the system requires you to create a new password. This is for security purposes and we suggest you have your passwords written down somewhere safe to refer to! If you can't remember your password, you can request for a Password Reset when logging in (see below).
