Greetings Parents/Guardians:

We are finally getting to enjoy some sunshine and it is starting to feel like summer will soon be upon us, which means the end of the year is quickly approaching. The final sprint will be filled with a range of activities from field trips to assemblies, music and athletic celebrations, and a PAC run Country Fair this Friday night. Even as one school year comes to a close, our staff begins planning for the new one in September. We will be expanding by one division and we are hard at work determining where classes will be located and hiring for positions coming available. As a staff, we work closely to formulate – by hand – the composition of each of the classes next year. This is a laborious process and a lot of time, thought and care goes into the classes we build. Classes have a range of stipulations regarding how large they can be, and there are also composition guidelines. We look at striking a gender balance as well as balancing the range of learning needs students have, the leadership they exhibit, student connections etc. If there is something you think we need to know about your child, feel free to email me, but please be aware that I do not entertain teacher requests.

One other area that parents often have concerns about is the grade their child will be in and whether they will feel behind, or need more challenge. I have often explained grade concerns to parents with the following example. If I had a grade three class made up of grade three students who were all born on exactly the same day, I would not have a class of students who were all at the same level. Some students would excel in math based problems; some would find reading challenging; others would be advanced verbally, but find written output difficult. There is a reason our revised curriculum has so many options for personalizing learning and enabling students to show their learning in a range of ways: the learning journey is personal for each student. I am blessed to have a staff made up of caring, innovative teachers who work so hard to provide a wide range of learning opportunities to our students, and I feel confident that no matter where your child is placed, they will be cared for and empowered to learn.
