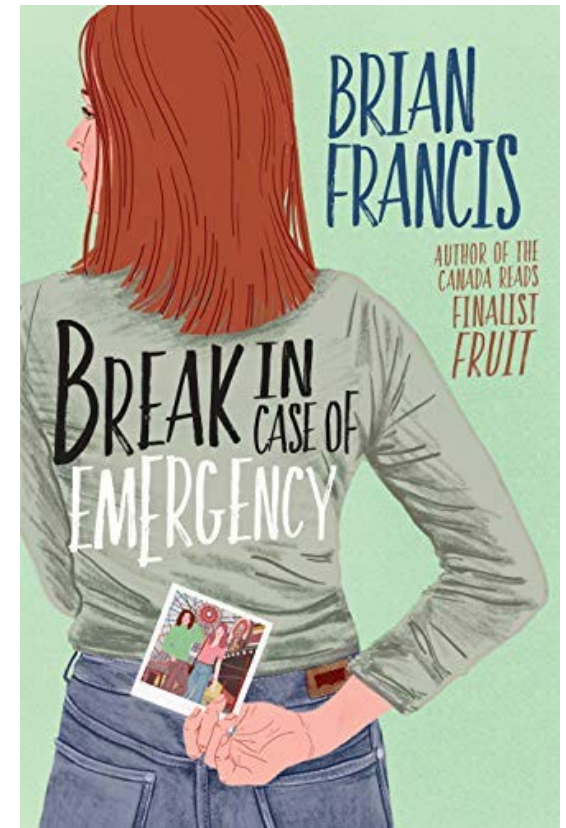
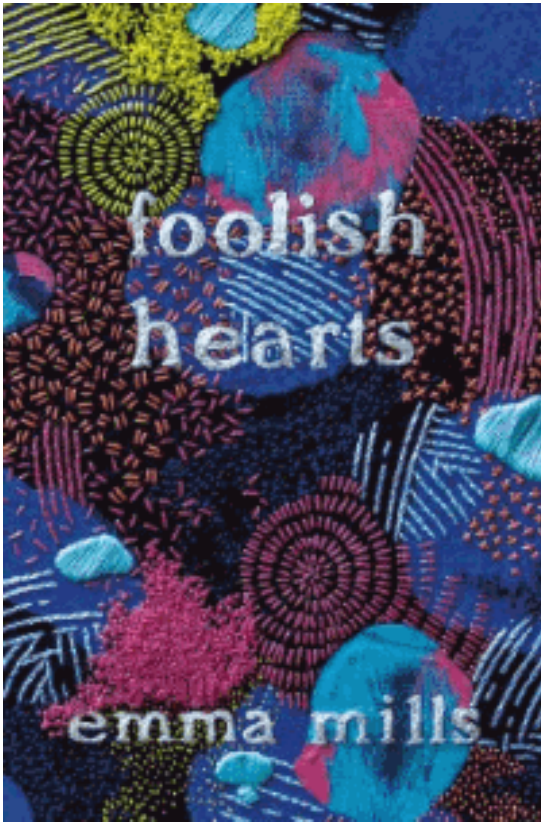

- Maintain a minimum grade percentage of 65
