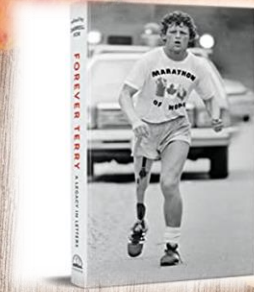

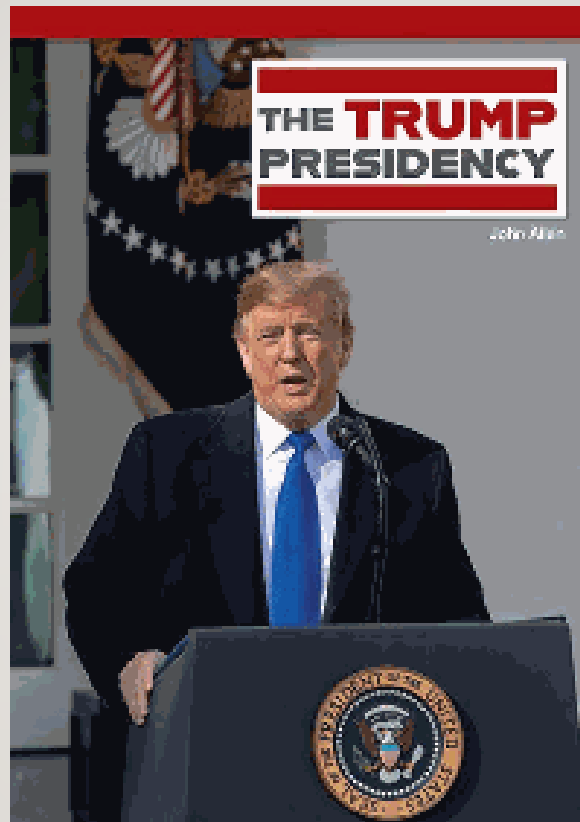

2020-2021 PROGRAM INFORMATION



## SUMMARY

We match young women, Two-Spirit, trans and non-binary youth (mentees) in Grades 11 and 12 across Metro Vancouver with a mentor to better prepare for their futures. Mentor-mentee matches are based on career and education goals, hobbies, and the level of support required. A mentor can help you explore your academic and professional interests, support you in your transition to university and help nurture your leadership ability!

**\*Please Note: To keep mentees and mentors safe during COVID-19, regular in-person programming will be moved onto an online platform for the time being.**

## MENTEES WHO WILL BENEFIT MOST

- Know what they want out of the relationship and are able to express their needs to their mentor
- Take initiative and are not afraid to ask questions, make suggestions and express their opinions
- Are committed, motivated, flexible and open!

## YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintain regular and frequent contact with your mentor, schedule monthly online or phone meetings from November to June
- Maintain contact with the YWCA Program Coordinator via email, send in monthly journals and attend YWCA events/workshops

## OUR MENTORS

- Are empathetic graduate students or professional women, Two-Spirit, trans and non-binary individuals
- Are positive role models that are easy to talk to who will share their knowledge and encourage you to explore your career and education interests
- Will connect you with others in the community to grow your network

## WHAT DO MATCHES DO TOGETHER?

- Chat about career/education interests and goals over the phone or online
- Virtually explore a university campus, office tour or job shadow, attend a virtual art class or work out session!
- Attend free monthly online YWCA Workshops on topics related to career exploration, stress reduction, university prep, leadership and more!

# Lester B. Pearson International Scholarship Program

The Lester B. Pearson International Scholarship Program at the University of Toronto is intended to recognize international students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement and creativity and who are recognized as leaders within their school. A special emphasis is placed on the impact the student has had on the life of their school and community, and their future potential to contribute positively to the global community. Awarded annually, these scholarships recognize outstanding students from around the world, including international students studying at Canadian high schools. This is U of T's most prestigious and competitive scholarship for international students. Each year approximately 37 students will be named Lester B. Pearson Scholars.

## Eligibility:

- an international student (i.e. a non-Canadian requiring a study permit)
- an original and creative thinker committed to school and community
- a high achiever in academic and creative pursuits
- enthusiastic about learning and intellectual exploration
- have demonstrated strong leadership skills
- currently in their final year of secondary school
- intending to begin university in the upcoming academic year
- **If you are interested in being considered for nomination for the Lester B Pearson International Scholarship please return the completed fillable pdf application to Ms. Butler no later than 12:30 pm on Thursday October 30. One student can be nominated. No late applications will be accepted.**
