Did you apply to UBC by Dec. 01? Did you know the deadline to apply for the UBC Centennial Scholars Entrance Awards has been extended? New deadline is Dec. 15, 2020.

The UBC Centennial Scholars Entrance Award program assists students who are transitioning to UBC from secondary school or another post-secondary institution. The purpose of the program is to financially support academically qualified students who show an interest in joining and contributing to the UBC community, but who would not be able to attend without significant financial assistance. Through the program, new students can access a variety of one-time and renewable awards of up to \$80,000.

Summer STEM Institute

Making research and mentorship accessible to high school students.

- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) is a 6-week virtual summer program from June 20 to August 1, 2021. SSI is an international program that provides academically talented and highly motivated students the opportunity to learn through a data science and research bootcamp, a Masterclass lecture series, weekend challenges, and a mentored research project.
- **Bootcamp:** learn how to design and conduct a data science research project.
- Pursuing research in high school is difficult. Many students are scientifically curious and are eager to conduct research but often lack the right training to do so. The SSI Bootcamp empowers motivated high school students with the training to conduct data science research projects.
- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) program was started last summer by educators, students, and graduates from Stanford, Harvard, and MIT. Last year, SSI received over 2,450 applications from students in 78 different countries.

Many students who attended the program said SSI changed their lives and asked for the team to continue running SSI in future years. Applications for SSI 2021 have just opened.

The program consists of three main parts:

- **Research and data science bootcamp:** Students learn how to design and conduct data science research projects. Students learn about the research process and how to apply statistical and machine learning methods to address scientific questions with real-world impact.
- **Masterclass lecture series:** Students are connected to accomplished young adults around the world. Students have the opportunity to learn about entrepreneurship from Forbes 30 Under 30 recipients, science research from International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) grand prize winners, and other topics from speakers with diverse backgrounds and experiences.
- **Mentored research project:** Students complete a research project through a rigorous, hands-on learning experience under the guidance of mentors. Previously, students have worked in a variety of fields, from computational biology to quantum physics.

Forklift + Bobcat (aka Steer Skid) Training

These two training opportunities are both **1-day training courses** that will teach you to properly and safely operate a **forklift** (gas + propane) and **bobcat** (bucket and/or forks).

- The programs will use both **theory** (classroom) and **practical** (on the vehicle) learning.

 - car, truck, motorcycle, ATV
- wear required personal protection equipment (**PPE**):
 - **mask** as per CoVid19 safety protocol
 - **CSA approved safety boots** (not the 'gumboot' style)
 - **high visibility vest**
- **dress appropriately** for indoor and outdoor conditions

Occupational First Aid (OFA) - Level 1

Occupational First Aid (OFA) Level 1 is a one-day course designed to cover all medical techniques considered to be within the responsibility of the Occupational First Aid Level 1 Attendant as required by the Workers' Compensation Board of BC (WCB).



Given CoVid19 and safety protocols:

- class size will be limited to 8 students
- gloves and masks are mandatory
 - trainer will supply both these PPE items (students may bring their own mask if preferred)

Course information:

- time: 8.30am and runs until 4.30pm
 - with appropriate coffee and lunch breaks... bring your own food or there is a fast-food restaurant nearby
- age: must be at least 16 years old at the time of the course
- cost: \$80 + GST (\$84 total)
- location: Universal Health & Safety at #201 - 4199 Lougheed Hwy, Burnaby
 - 10-minute walk from Gilmore Skytrain station

Main topics covered include:

- Basic Life Support (CPR - A) -- CPR with Automated Defibrillator Training
- Small Wound Management
- Critical Airway, breathing and circulation interventions with C-spine management

In order to be successful, participants must demonstrate practical skill competency and achieve 70% on a multiple choice exam. On successful completion of the course, participants receive a 3-year certification.

- certification: government-issued photo ID is required to receive a certificate (ex: driver's license, passport, NEXUS, BCID,...)

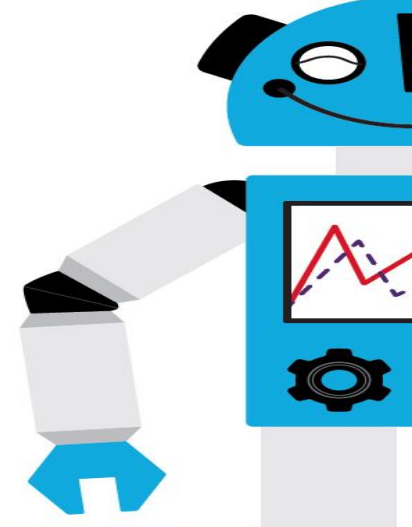

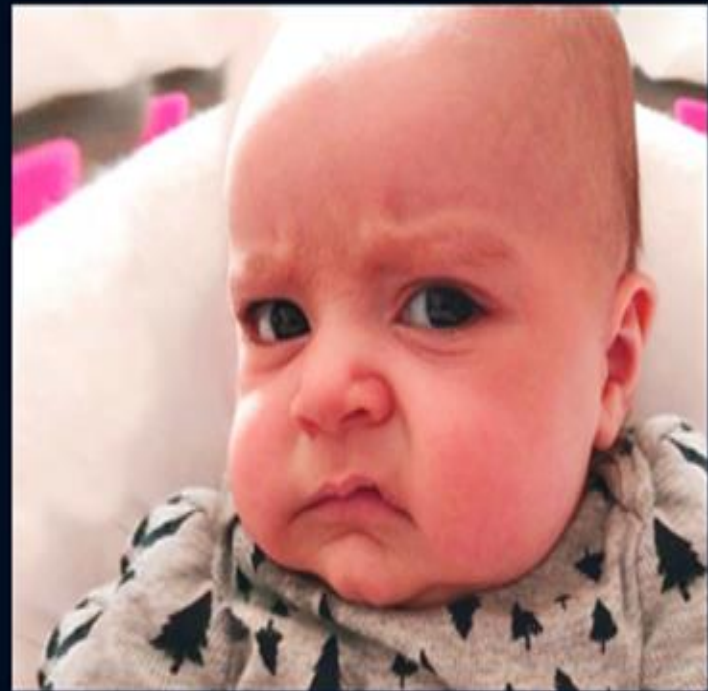

Looking for Snow Angels

- The Snow Angels program is actively recruiting volunteers for the winter season. We are looking for volunteers to assist individuals in our community who are unable to clear snow from the city sidewalks due to physical disabilities or restrictions. This is an on call position for volunteers until March 31; weather dependent.

To Be a Snow Angel you must:

- Be 16 years of age or older;
- Live within close proximity of the participants houses; you can sign up for addresses that are close to you from the volunteer database;
- Clear snow from your matched city sidewalk(s) within 10 hours of the cessation (stop) of any snowfall that caused any accumulation of snow or ice on any city sidewalk
- Complete the snow shoveling before 7:30 pm (not to shovel in the dark)
- Be in adequate physical condition and capable of clearing snow
- Shovel, safety vest, toque and scarf are provided! (if needed)

Commitment: 1-2 homes per individual for the winter season; which is typically from mid-November to the end of March.

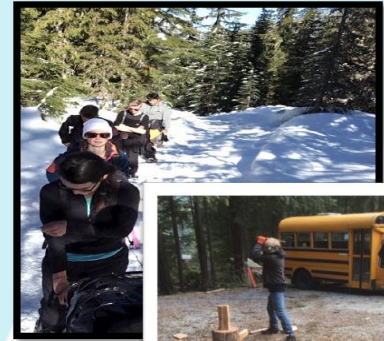
