The British Columbia School Superintendents Association will award six regional scholarships to students planning to pursue post-secondary studies.



BCSSA Scholarships for 2021 – Deadline March 5, 2021: Applications are now available on our website for the 2021 BCSSA Scholarship program. Each Chapter is provided \$1000 for a deserving graduating student. This year – the theme will be on how the student has made a positive difference in the life or lives of others during the pandemic.

Students wishing to be considered for a scholarship must be currently enrolled in their final year of studies at a public secondary school in British Columbia and expected to graduate in June 2021. One winner will be chosen from each of the six BCSSA provincial chapters (Fraser Valley, Kootenay-Boundary, Metro, Vancouver Island, Northern, Thompson-Okanagan). Each winner will be awarded a \$1,000 scholarship. In selecting the recipients for this year's awards, the scholarship committees will consider demonstrated exemplary service and leadership within the school and community.

Letters of reference will be required affirming the applicant's accomplishments and efforts to improve the quality of life for young people and others during the COVID19 pandemic.

In addition, the applicant must submit a short description (450 words maximum) of how his/her efforts have made a difference in the life or lives of others in the pandemic context.

The winners will be announced in late spring 2021.

Position Summary:

Simon Fraser University Summer Camp Volunteers are responsible for helping to provide a safe, fun environment for camp participants and for being a role model to camp participants. Volunteers may also be responsible for assisting with the supervision of camp participants during lunch, pre or post care. 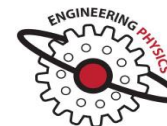

What is Engineering Physics?

"Fizz" is a fully-accredited engineering program with an extra emphasis on math and physics for students who want to work at the forefront of technology and science. 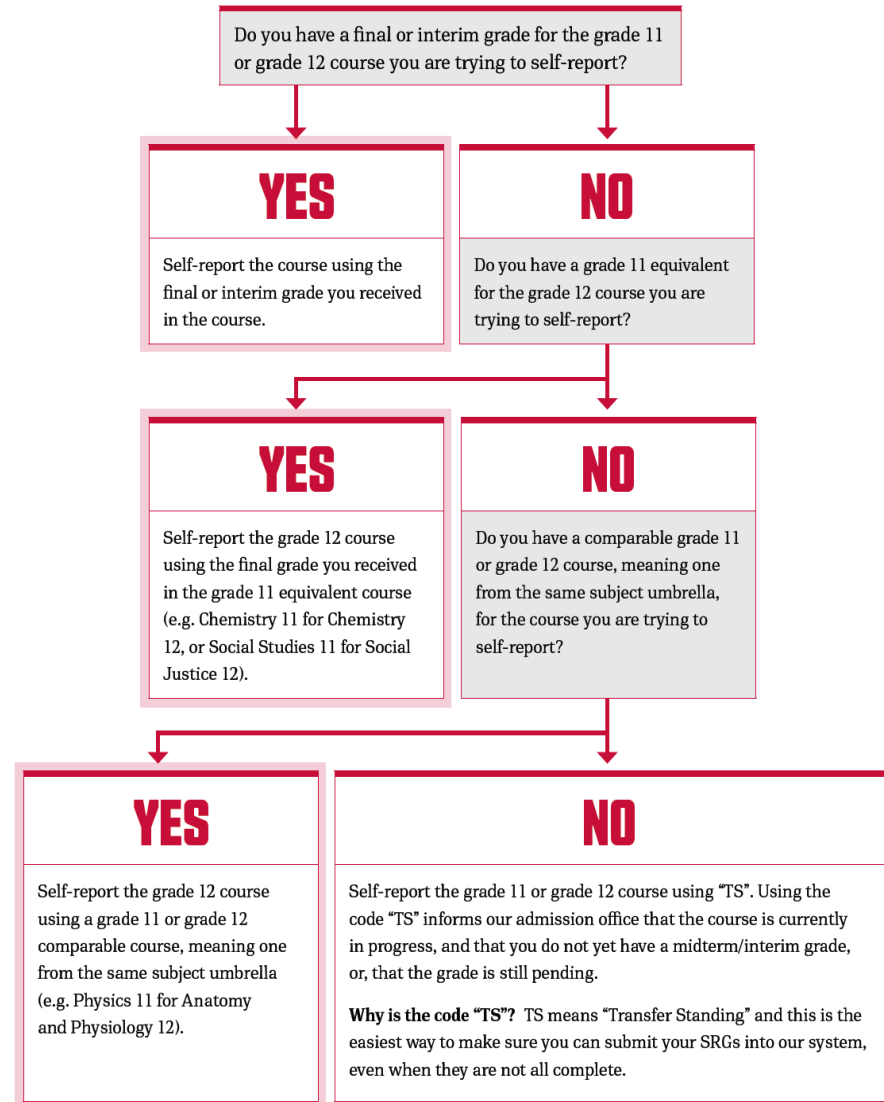

Summer STEM Institute

Making research and mentorship accessible to high school students.

The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) is a 6-week virtual summer program from **June 20 to August 1, 2021**. SSI is an international program that provides academically talented and highly motivated students the opportunity to learn through a data science and research bootcamp, a Masterclass lecture series, weekend challenges, and a mentored research project.

- **Bootcamp:** learn how to design and conduct a data science research project.
- Pursuing research in high school is difficult. Many students are scientifically curious and are eager to conduct research but often lack the right training to do so. The SSI Bootcamp empowers motivated high school students with the training to conduct data science research projects.
- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) program was started last summer by educators, students, and graduates from Stanford, Harvard, and MIT. Last year, SSI received over 2,450 applications from students in 78 different countries.

Many students who attended the program said SSI changed their lives and asked for the team to continue running SSI in future years. Applications for SSI 2021 have just opened.

The program consists of three main parts:

- **Research and data science bootcamp:** Students learn how to design and conduct data science research projects. Students learn about the research process and how to apply statistical and machine learning methods to address scientific questions with real-world impact.
- **Masterclass lecture series:** Students are connected to accomplished young adults around the world. Students have the opportunity to learn about entrepreneurship from Forbes 30 Under 30 recipients, science research from International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) grand prize winners, and other topics from speakers with diverse backgrounds and experiences.
- **Mentored research project:** Students complete a research project through a rigorous, hands-on learning experience under the guidance of mentors. Previously, students have worked in a variety of fields, from computational biology to quantum physics.
