It's time once again for the ATLAS Particle Physics Masterclass. Registration is now open on eventbrite. This event has moved online and will now be held over a half day. Activities have been expanded to include a virtual tour of the world's largest particle detector at CERN, the ATLAS experiment.

Intended for grade 11 and 12 students, those who enroll in Saturday's masterclass will receive an invite to Friday's tour. This event will be recorded and shared more generally following the event.

During the half-day online event every student will have the opportunity to:

Learn about research topics and methods that are fundamental to particle physics

Analyze measurements on real data from the ATLAS particle physics experiment at CERN

Network with other high school students and researchers to discuss results

Health Care Access Program: Job Opportunity after graduation

COVID-19 has increased the need for additional staff in long-term care and assisted living services. Typically, these positions require prior experience and education. The Health Career Access Program provides a path for applicants with no health care experience to get hired and receive on-the-job training.

How to get your career started

- COVID-19 has increased the need for health care assistants in long-term care and assisted living services.
- Normally, to become a health care assistant, you must complete six to eight months of post-secondary education at your own
 expense before you can apply for a position.
- Through the Health Career Access Program, the Province will pay for your post-secondary education.

New hires in the program start in a health care support worker position and receive paid training that leads to full qualification as a health care assistant.

Please note: All successful program applicants must start as a health care support worker before advancing to a health care assistant position.

Health care support worker

- Health care support workers are supervised by registered nurses or other regulated health care professionals. They provide a
 variety of critical non-clinical, non-direct care supports to patients and residents.
- Typical duties include:
- Participating as an integral member of a healthcare delivery team
- Establishing a caring relationship with clients, residents and families
- Providing support and assistance with mealtime activities
- Providing support and assistance in carrying out activities
- Performing housekeeping duties
- Greeting and directing visitors
- Restocking supplies
- Completing and maintaining relevant records
- Health care support workers earn \$20.95 an hour.



Summer STEM Institute

Making research and mentorship accessible to high school students.

The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) is a 6-week virtual summer program from June 20 to August 1, 2021. SSI is an international program that provides academically talented and highly motivated students the opportunity to learn through a data science and research bootcamp, a Masterclass lecture series, weekend challenges, and a mentored research project.

- Bootcamp: learn how to design and conduct a data science research project.
- Pursuing research in high school is difficult. Many students are scientifically curious and are eager to conduct research but often lack the right training to do so. The SSI Bootcamp empowers motivated high school students with the training to conduct data science research projects.
- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) program was started last summer by educators, students, and graduates from Stanford, Harvard, and MIT. Last year, SSI received over 2,450 applications from students in 78 different countries.

Many students who attended the program said SSI changed their lives and asked for the team to continue running SSI in future years. Applications for SSI 2021 have just opened.

The program consists of three main parts:

- Research and data science bootcamp: Students learn how to design and conduct data science research projects. Students learn about the research process and how to apply statistical and machine learning methods to address scientific questions with real-world impact.
- Masterclass lecture series: Students are connected to accomplished young adults around the world. Students have the opportunity
 to learn about entrepreneurship from Forbes 30 Under 30 recipients, science research from International Science and Engineering
 Fair (ISEF) grand prize winners, and other topics from speakers with diverse backgrounds and experiences.
- Mentored research project: Students complete a research project through a rigorous, hands-on learning experience under the guidance of mentors. Previously, students have worked in a variety of fields, from computational biology to quantum physics.
