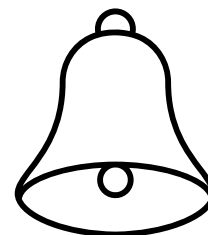

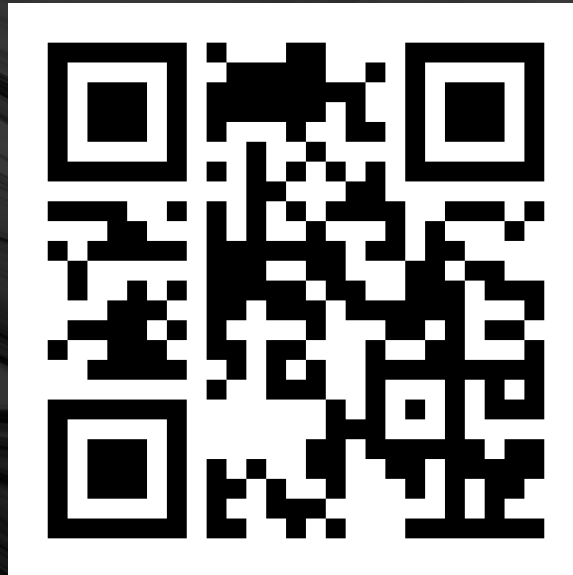

CONGRATULATIONS SWIMMERS

The girls relay team made up of Tiffany, Mackenna Petty, Ada L., and Gaile L. finished 9th overall in the 200m Medley relay.

The boys relay team made up of Matthew, Brendan C., Ian L., and Grigorii Z. placed 11th overall in the 200m Freestyle relay.

Overall, all 8 Kodiak swimmers qualified for finals which made for a very successful weekend

- CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR SWIMMERS

Matthew W. (grade 11) was ranked first overall in the province for 50-meter Breaststroke. He had a strong preliminary race and went into finals as the third seed. He dug deep, swam a personal best 0:31.99, and won the race by half a body length to become provincial champion and take home the gold medal! Matthew Wu also finished 14th overall for 50-meter freestyle, and 6th overall for the 100-meter Individual Medley.

Tiffany T. (grade 12) had strong preliminary swims for both of her individual events. She set herself up for a strong showing on Saturday and is taking home a silver medal in the 100-meter Butterfly, and a very close 4th place finish in the 200-meter Individual Medley.

ADULTING 101: PERSONAL FINANCE FOR STUDENTS PREPARING FOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY

A Zoom-based financial literacy workshop for grade 10-12 students from UVIC's Gustavson School of Business

[Surveys](#) routinely show Canadians [struggle](#) with their finances—over half [are within \\$200](#) of not being able to cover their bills and debt payments.

High school and university students particularly face struggles. [Rising student debt](#), increasing housing costs, and surging inflation are barriers to success. *Generation Z* not only faces the burdens of climate change, the pandemic, and global uncertainty—but costs alone are a barrier to progress in careers and life.

So, how can students prepare for the costs of “adulthood” and identify opportunities while at university?

The Gustavson School of Business at UVic invites all grade 10/11 students to join a free financial literacy workshop. Dr. Michael King leads this interactive session for students to strengthen and prepare their financial footing to enter university life. This workshop will give you a taste of Gustavson and finance through a fun and engaging session.
